Road Reconstruction and Pedestrian Safety Improvements on Borden Street from College Street to Harbord Street

Contract: 22ECS-TI-09SP

Start Date: March 2023 NEW End Date: early-November 2023*

This notice provides an update on the infrastructure improvements along Borden Street. Remaining work is expected to be complete by early November 2023.

We know this project has an impact to all businesses and residents in the area. We sympathize and appreciate your patience with the dust, noise, fencing and other inconveniences.

WORK COMPLETED TO DATE

The City's contractor has:

- Reconstructed sidewalks between Harbord Street and Ulster Street
- Replaced the City-owned portion of substandard water services between Harbord Street and Vankoughnet Street


REMAINING WORK

The City's contractor will:

- Continue to replace substandard water service connections from Vankoughnet Street to College Street
- Reconstruct sidewalks from Ulster Street to College Street
- Reconstruct the road from Harbord Street to College Street, including pedestrian safety improvements at the intersection of Borden Street and Ulster Street.
- · Place new pavement markings
- · Restore all areas affected by construction

Road reconstruction involves removing the asphalt surface and concrete road base, laying a new road base, base asphalt and top asphalt. Road reconstruction work will begin at Harbord Street and move south to College Street.
