
This notice provides an update on the infrastructure improvement project being carried out by the City of Toronto and Toronto Transit Commission (TTC). Watermain replacement work (Phase 1) is nearing completion and streetcar track renewal (Phase 2) work is anticipated to begin the **week of October 16, 2023**.

During Phase 2, the intersection of Dufferin Street and Springhurst Avenue will be fully closed to vehicle traffic until late December 2023 to carry out the remaining work.

This project will continue to be coordinated with the emergency repairs of the Dufferin Street Bridge.

This work is required to bring the aging infrastructure to a state of good repair and is part of the Council-approved 2023 Capital Works Program.

Phase 2 Mid-October to late- December	 Crews will: Replace the TTC streetcar track within 150 metres of the intersection to the end of Fort Rouille Street. Remove and replace concrete and rails. Restore the road from Dufferin Street to Fort Rouille Street. 	 Dufferin Street at Springhurst Avenue and Tyndall Avenue will be fully closed to vehicles. Springhurst Avenue will be fully closed to vehicles at Fort Rouille Street with no access to Dufferin Street. Vehicle access will be maintained along Tyndall Avenue and King Street East to move east and west.

24	Work Hours: Phase 2 work will take place 24 hours, 7 days a week. Excavation activities and heavy breaking of concrete will be carried out at various times throughout the day. All concrete breaking activities will occur between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m. Around-the-clock work is required during rail installation by TTC crews to preserve the integrity and quality of new rail and concrete. Overnight rail work by TTC may consist of moving new rail into position, rail installation and rail welding/grinding. Concrete breaking work is the most disruptive and will typically last the first 1-2 days of this phase of construction.
(\mathbb{R})	Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.
	Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.
	 Starting October 8, 2023 to late December 2023 (Phase 2): The 504B King streetcar will continue to bypass stops on Dufferin Street south of King Street West and instead continue further west at Roncesvalles Avenue (Dundas West Station) via King Street West. The 29 Dufferin bus and 329 Dufferin Night bus will terminate at Princess Gate via Liberty Street and East Liberty Street. The 929 Dufferin Express buses will also bypass the Dufferin Gate Loop and instead terminate at Exhibition Loop via Liberty Street and East Liberty Street.
