Bloor Street West Culvert Replacement over Elmcrest Creek

Contract: 22ECS-BE-04BSE Start Date: December 05, 2022 NEW End Date: June 2024 *Timeline is subject to change.

This notice provides an update on the replacement of the Bloor Street West Culvert over Elmcrest Creek. Work on this project is currently behind schedule due to utility conflicts and material supply chain issues. The City's contractor is working diligently to complete the remainder of the project. Due to these delays, work is now expected to be completed by June 2024.

The roadway is expected to be reopened to bidirectional traffic by December 2023, followed by a winter shutdown until April 2024. The project team is currently investigating ways to improve the schedule. We understand this project has inconvenienced businesses and residents along Bloor Street West. We appreciate your patience with the ongoing construction.

WORK STATUS TO DATE

To date, the following work has been completed:

- Installed the north half of the new culvert, including the parapet wall with aluminum railing and armour stone retaining walls.
- Protection and relocation of conflicting underground and overhead utilities.

REMAINING WORK

In the coming months, the City's contractor will be completing the following work:

- Install new culvert and construct new armour stone retaining walls on the south side of Bloor Street West at Elmcrest Creek.
- Remove and replace the concrete parapet wall with aluminum railing, sidewalk, curb and gutter, asphalt and steel beam guide rail.
- Stabilize and restore all disturbed areas, including the watercourse in the immediate vicinity of the culvert.
