TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE: Wild Ginger Way Road

Contract: 21ECS-LU-05FP Expected Start Date: October 16, 2023 Expected End Date: October 31, 2023 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm and sanitary sewer system in your area in order to reduce surface and basement flooding. Due to the depth and nature of the sanitary sewer construction work on Wild Gingerway Road, the road will be closed between house numbers 2 to 14 effective 7:00 a.m. on Monday, October 16, 2023 to 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, October 31, 2023.

Motorists are reminded to abide by traffic/construction signs posted in local areas to ensure the safe travel of all local road users, pedestrians, and cyclists. This project is part of the Council-approved 2022 Basement Flooding Protection Program to improve the water distribution system; renew our aging infrastructure and reduce the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups and flooding.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

8	Traffic Management : Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.
	Wild Ginger Way Road will be closed between houses 2 and 14. Access to Wild Ginger Way Road from Bathurst Street will remain open and incoming traffic will be directed to the right upon entering Wild Gingerway Road. To exit Wild Gingerway, drivers are to return using the same route taken in from Bathurst Street.
大	Pedestrians: The work may require temporary sidewalk restrictions, however any necessary sidewalk closures will alternate in each direction to ensure pedestrian access is maintained during construction.
	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
Ŀ	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
