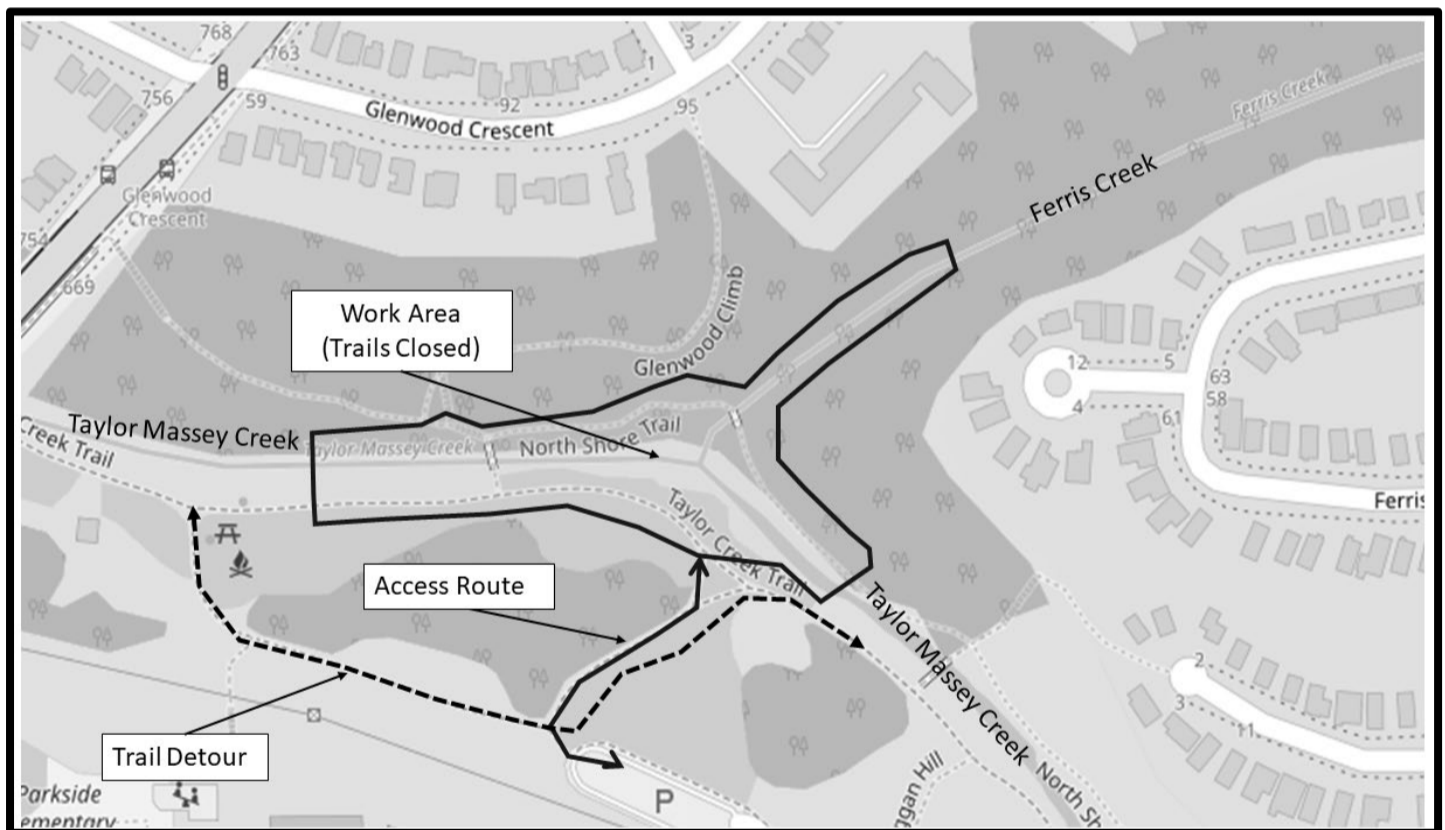
Storm Sewer Outfall and Pedestrian Bridge Replacement in Taylor Creek Park

Contract: 21ECS-LU-05SM
Expected Start Date: November 2023
Expected End Date: April 2024
**Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto plans to restore sections of Taylor Massey Creek and Ferris Creek north of Haldon Avenue that have been damaged due to creek erosion. This creek erosion has resulted in the exposure of sanitary sewer infrastructure and damage to a storm outfall. The work area is located on public lands behind private properties on Ferris Road and Glenwood Crescent as shown on the map below.

The restoration works will include the replacement of a storm sewer outfall and two pedestrian bridges, and restoration of the pedestrian trail on the north side of Taylor Massey Creek currently at-risk from creek erosion. The work will also include the placement of armour stone along the creek banks and bed to protect sanitary sewer infrastructure impacted by creek erosion. This project is part of the Council-approved 2023 Capital Works Program to renew infrastructure.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Use a section of Taylor Massey Creek near the parking lot off Haldon Avenue as a construction staging area;
- Provide a trail detour that connects to the Taylor Massey Creek Trail during construction;
- Mark trees for protection and removal;
- Work within Taylor Massey Creek to rehabilitate the watercourse, replace a storm sewer outfall and two pedestrian bridges and restore the pedestrian trail.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise, and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Accessible Accommodation: Trails will be closed in the work area during construction, including the two bridges in the work area. The City's contractor will establish and maintain a safe and accessible detour that connects to the paved portion of Taylor Massey Creek Trail during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Project Manager listed below.</p>
	<p>Access to Your Home: Dynex Construction Inc. may need access to the interior and exterior of your home to complete a pre-construction condition survey. Affected properties will receive a request to schedule a time to complete the pre-construction condition survey. Although participation is voluntary, the pre-construction survey results may be useful to confirm claims for potential damage caused by City construction.</p>
	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Tree Removal: Due to the nature of this project, the City will have to remove trees from public property within Taylor Creek Park. A tree removal permit has been obtained in coordination with the City's Parks, Recreation & Forestry Division. Trees removed for the project will be replaced following construction.</p>
	<p>Parks and Trails: Due to the nature of this work, access to Taylor Massey Creek Trail is restricted to the public. Affected areas will be fenced off and closed for public safety. Signs will be posted. All areas affected by construction will be restored.</p>
