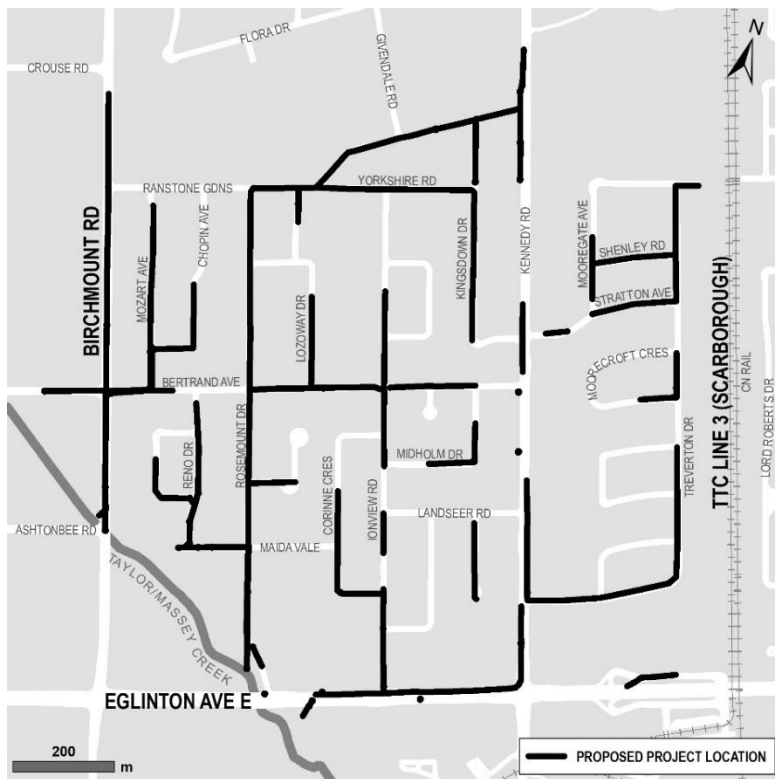


# Basement Flooding Study Area 47

## Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Notice of Study Completion

The City of Toronto has completed a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) study that examines surface and basement flooding within Study Area 47 and identifies improvements that can be made to city infrastructure to reduce the risk of future flooding. The area is bound by Birchmount Road to the west, TTC Line 3/CN Rail corridor to the east, Hydro-electric power corridor to the north and Eglinton Ave E to the south and has experienced basement and surface flooding during severe rainstorms in the past.



Following consultation, the City is recommending:

- Storm sewer inline storage along Kingsdown Drive, Yorkshire Road, Rosemount Drive, Lozoway Drive, Bertrand Avenue, Maida Vale, Ranstone Gardens, Birchmount Road, Chopin Avenue, Mozart Avenue, Hughey Crescent, Reno Drive, Corinne Crescent, Ionview Road, Bonny Lynn Court, Kennedy Road, Shenley Road, Stratton Avenue, Treverton Drive, and Eglinton Avenue E.
- Sanitary sewer inline storage along Ionview Road
- Redirect storm sewer flows from Maida Vale to Rosemount Drive, Bertrand Road west to Rosemount Drive, Bertrand Road east to Birchmount Drive, Ionview Road, and Rensburg Drive south to Eglinton Ave E., and Ionview Road west to Bertrand Avenue
- Upgrade and lower sanitary sewers on Rosemount Drive
- Lower sanitary sewers on Mozart Avenue, Bertrand Avenue, and Birchmount Road
- Upgrade of two outfalls off of Rosemount Drive and Birchmount Drive
- Increase inlet capacity for the storm system.

The study has been planned following the Schedule B process in the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment.
