Overview

On October 1, 2023, the study team held two community pop-up events in the Kennedy Parklonview Parkland Study Area: one outside of Don Montgomery Community Recreation Centre and one at Jack Goodlad Park. In total, more than 65 community members shared their ideas with the project team.

The purpose of the pop-up events was to inform the community about the study's ongoing work, and to gather further ideas directly from park and facility users.

Display boards were set up featuring common themes that came out of Phase 1 engagement activities. Participants shared further feedback by writing on sticky notes and posting them under each theme that resonated with them. The project team was also available to collect feedback and answer questions.

What We Heard – Key Themes

Participants' feedback around each of the themes are summarized below.

The statement on the pop-up display boards was "I want the parks and outdoor spaces to..."

Feel safe

- More park programming and appeal to increase park usage more activities and people increase safety for women
- Stop alcohol use
- Ample lighting is needed in parks, as well as:
 - More lighting at entrances to ravines
 - Brighter lights
 - Lighting at playgrounds and baseball diamonds
 - Lighting in parking lots

Have ample shade

- Shade needed near splash pads and dog off-leash areas
- More shade structures are needed

Have regular upkeep

- Washrooms need to be open year-round
- Washrooms and other facilities (heating in community recreation centres, basketball rims, change rooms, etc.) need to be cleaned, upgraded and maintained better
- Paving needs to be maintained or redone in parking lots, bike trails, and basketball courts
- More garbage bins are needed to prevent overflowing
- Some parks are better maintained than others (e.g. McCowan District Park and Treverton Park are well maintained)

Have space for sports and recreation

- More ice skating trails (such as the one at McCowan District Park), skateboard parks, basketball courts and swimming pools
- More outdoor fitness areas/equipment
- More recreation activities (including yoga classes)
- Update and install more playgrounds and splash pads





Have better pedestrian access

- Better connections, such as between Eglinton Ravine and Farlinger Ravine
- Better through-access for cyclists so that cycling on busy roads is not necessary
- Parking lots are helpful for people who stop for walks and other activities

Have well maintained trails

- More general maintenance needed, including in the winter
- Parks with trails (such as at Jack Goodlad Park) are well used
- Consider safety (widen trails, add mirrors, etc.) for shared cycling/walking trails, such as tight turns and visibility
- Consider shareable bicycle repair/maintenance tools along trails
- Some bike trails (such as on the Meadowway between Kennedy and Warden Rd.) need to be repayed
- Increase convenience and safety to encourage more cycling

Have accessible pathways

More extensive pathways

Other ideas that participants suggested included:

- More water fountains and bottle filling stations
- More picnic tables and seating in parks and other outdoor areas
- Consider adding fire pits
- More dog off-leash areas would decrease usage of other spaces for this (e.g. school yards, hydro corridor)
- Ensure the right facilities for the local community so people can access what they need; more connections with local agencies and service providers (e.g. for youth programming)
- Washrooms/change rooms need baby changing stations
- Ensure more programming and accessibility for all ages, including older adults
- Better signage so that people know these spaces (e.g. trails, park entrances, ravines) exist, especially if hidden from major routes
