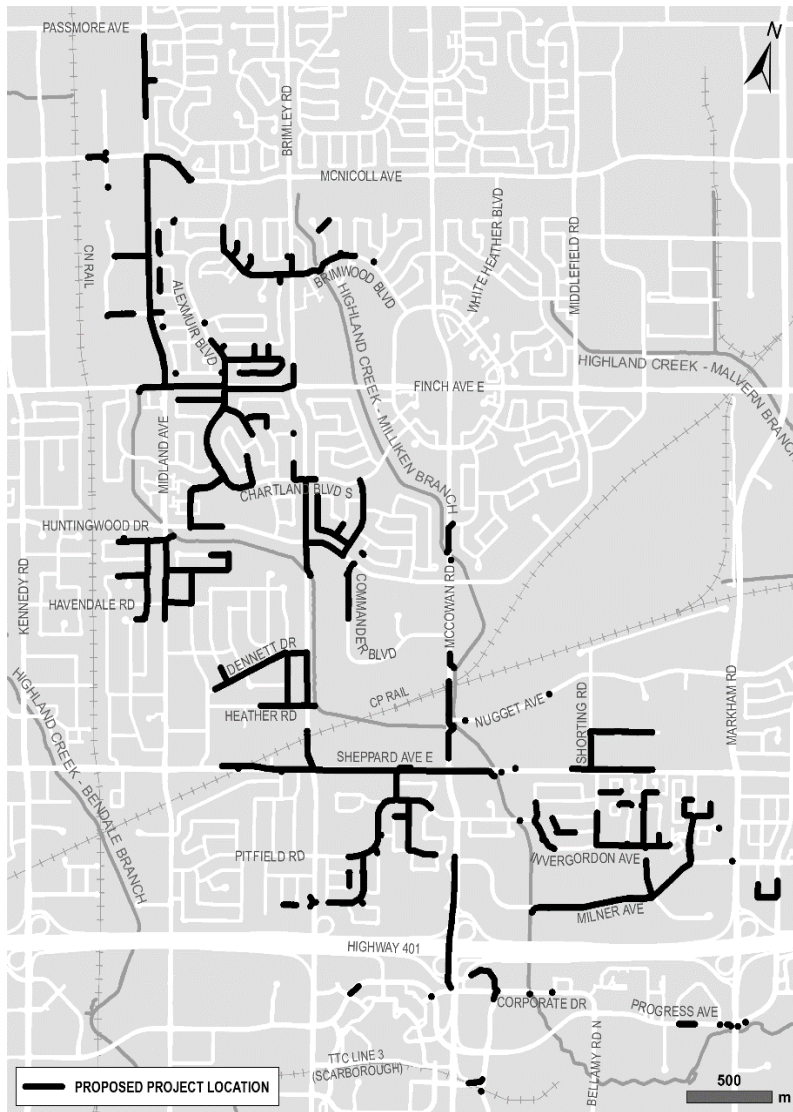


Basement Flooding Study Area 60

Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Notice of Study Completion

The City of Toronto has completed a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) study that examines surface and basement flooding within Study Area 60 and identifies improvements that can be made to city infrastructure to reduce the risk of future flooding. The study area is roughly bordered by Steeles Avenue to the north, Ellesmere Road to the south, Kennedy Road to the west, and Malvern Street to the east, and has experienced basement and surface flooding during severe rainstorms in the past.



Following consultation, the City is recommending:

- New and larger storm and sanitary sewers,
- Sections of large diameter storm and sanitary sewers to provide storage during heavy rainfall events,
- Sewer flow re-routing for more efficient drainage and construction,
- Curb removal to direct storm flows to watercourse,
- Storm outfall upgrades at Finch Ave East (discharges to Milliken Branch of Highland Creek) and Midland Avenue (discharges to Highland Creek),
- Catchbasin management to control surface water ponding to acceptable levels during large rainfalls, and,
- Continued enforcement of mandatory Downspout Disconnection Program.

The study has been planned as a Master Plan, following Phases 1 and 2 of the Municipal Class EA process.
