Toronto Local Appeal Body – Proposed Amendment to the TLAB's Decision-Writing Template

Summary

The Toronto Local Appeal Body will consider incorporating the proposed additional wording under the subheading – **The Legislative and Policy Framework** - in the Decision-Writing template.

The subheading 'Legislative and Policy Framework' in the template already includes **s. 3 – Provincial Policy,** as well as the requisite four-part tests in s. 45 and the criteria in s. 53 of the *Planning Act, R.S.O 1990. C. P.13 (Act)*.

The proposed amendment would add new wording referencing **s. 2 – Provincial Interest** – in the *Act*. The intent of incorporating this new section under the above-referenced subheading in the template is to address the directive in the *Act* that tribunals such as the Toronto Local Appeal Body shall have regard to matters of provincial interest, enumerated in **s. 2** as (a) - (s).

The Toronto Local Appeal Body – Impacts of Bill 23 – *The More Homes Built Faster Act,* 2022, on the current workload of the Toronto Local Appeal Body Panel Members

Summary

Since the introduction of Bill 23 – *The More Homer Built Faster Act, 2022*, which eliminated 'third-party' appeals to the Toronto Local Appeal Body (TLAB), the Tribunal has experienced a significant decrease in the number of appeal files received from the Committee of Adjustment.

While the TLAB has also seen a reduction in its Panel Member complement in the interim due to resignations, the assignment of files to the sitting Members continues to decline well below the expected two (2) hearings per week standard described in the position description.

The City of Toronto has posted the intention to fill four current vacancies in the TLAB Panel complement.

The TLAB Members submit that the City of Toronto should pause the process to fill these four vacancies until an understanding of the impacts of the reduced caseload resulting from the Committee of Adjustment (COA) Appeals can be established.
