TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE WESTGATE BOULEVARD AND SOUTHGATE AVENUE

Expected Start Date: January 31, 2024
Expected End Date: February 05, 2024

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm and sanitary sewer system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding. Due to the nature of the storm sewer construction work, **Westgate Boulevard will be temporarily closed at the intersection of Southgate Avenue and Westgate Boulevard from 7 a.m. on Wednesday January 31, 2024 to 7 p.m. on Monday February 05, 2024.** This project is part of the Council-approved 2023 Basement Flooding Protection Program to improve the water distribution system, renew our aging infrastructure and reduce the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups and flooding.

Work crews will:

- Modify and upgrade the storm and sanitary sewer system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- The community will experience dust, noise and traffic delays.
- The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The intersection at Southgate Avenue and Westgate Boulevard will be fully closed during the duration of the work. Local traffic on Southgate Avenue from Bathurst Street to Westgate Boulevard will be maintained. • When your driveway access is impacted, you will receive a notice 48 hours in advance. • There will be detour signs in the area to provide motorists with alternate routes.
	<p>Pedestrians: There are no existing sidewalks; however, safe pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.</p>
	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.</p>
