## TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE: Gorman Park Road

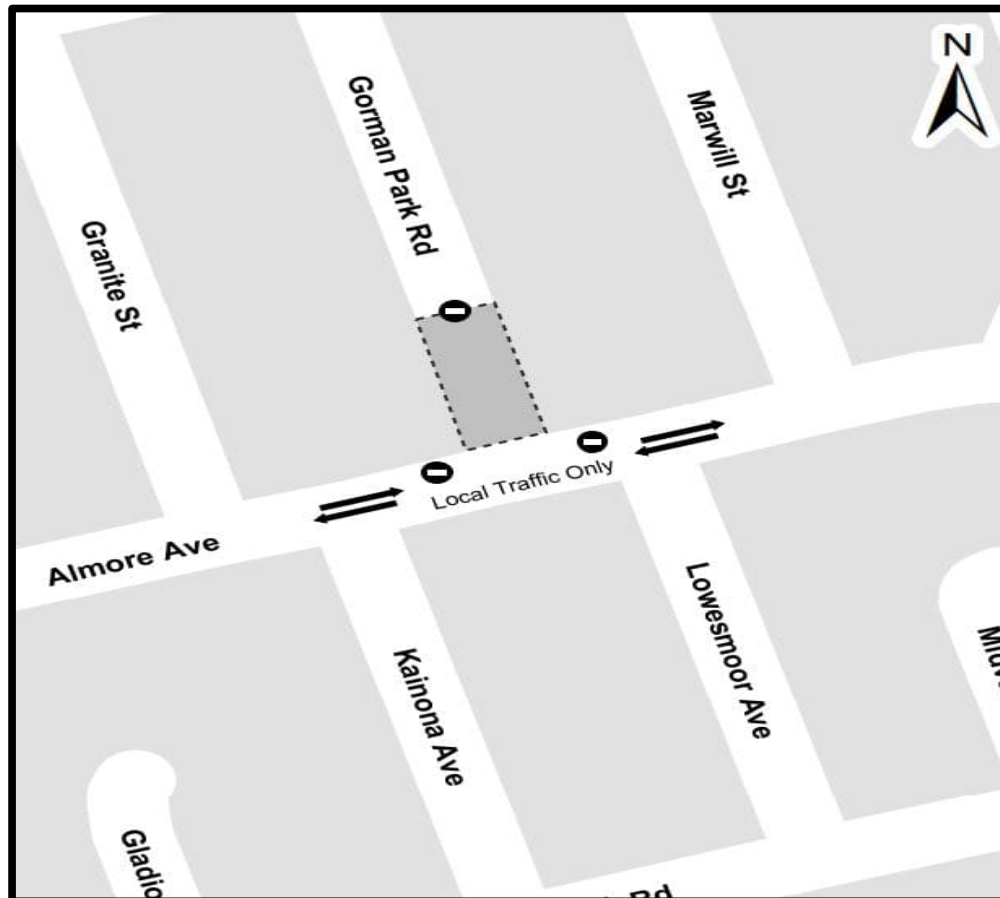
Expected Start Date: Monday, January 22, 2024

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm and sanitary sewer system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding. Due to the nature of the sanitary sewer construction work **Gorman Park Road will be temporarily closed from January 22, 2024, to March 29, 2024.** This project is part of the Council-approved 2023 Basement Flooding Protection Program to improve the water distribution system, renew our aging infrastructure and reduce the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups and flooding.

## WORK DETAILS

For this project, the contractor will be:

- modifying and upgrading the storm and sanitary sewer system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding.
- replacing the city-owned portion of substandard water services and sanitary sewer laterals.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- The community will experience dust, noise and traffic delays.
- The city will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.</p> <p><b>Traffic on Almore Street during the road closure:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Both traffic lanes on Almore Avenue to be maintained during the road closure.</li> <li>• Changes to the traffic control plan will be made to accommodate any site-specific situations as they arise.</li> </ul>
	<p><b>Physical Distancing:</b> There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing and will maintain physical distancing.</p>
	<p><b>Pedestrians:</b> The work may require temporary sidewalk restrictions. If pedestrians do not have any access to the existing sidewalk, the sidewalk will be detoured to an area adjacent to the work zone with protected barricades or will be detoured to the nearest controlled intersection to cross according to the traffic control set up.</p>
	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday.</p>
	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
