Expected End Date: March 29th, 2024

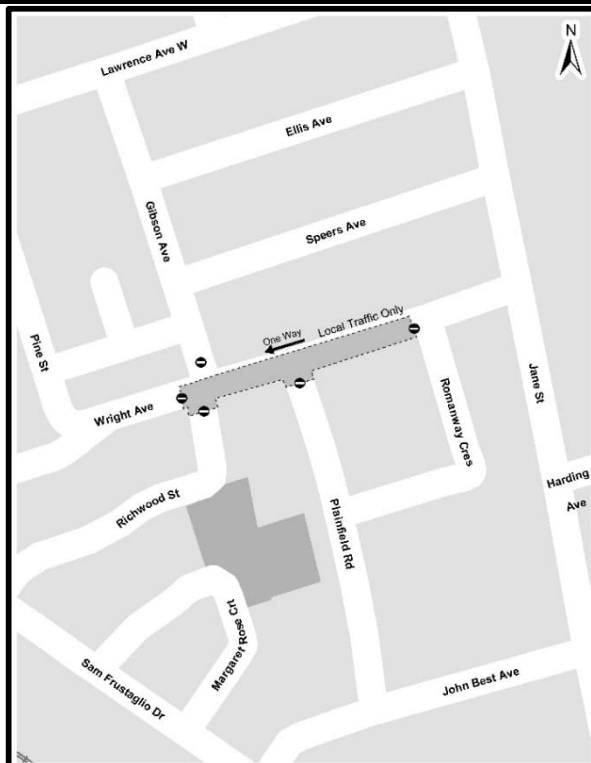

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm and combined sewer system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding. This work also involves replacing the City-owned portion of substandard water services and sewer laterals.

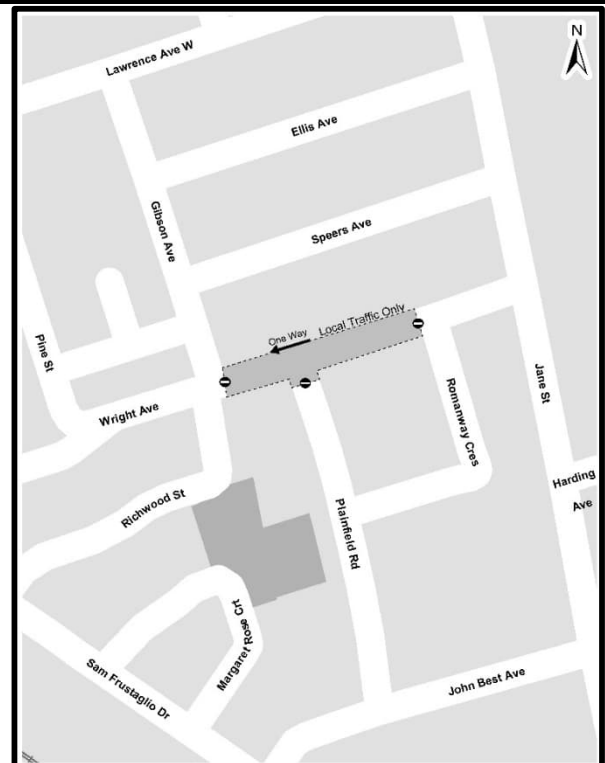
Due to the depth and nature of the work, Wright Avenue will be partially closed, allowing one way passage for local traffic only between January 15th to March 29th. The intersection at Wright Avenue and Richwood Street will be fully closed between January 15th to January 26th. We apologize for any inconvenience that this closure will cause in the neighbourhood, and we thank you for your continued patience as we complete the work.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2023 Basement Flooding Protection Program to improve the water distribution system, renew our aging infrastructure and reduce the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups and flooding.

	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • From January 15th to January 26th, the intersection of Wright Avenue and Richwood Street will be fully closed. • From January 15th to March 29th, traffic on Wright Avenue, from Richwood Street to Romanway Crescent will be reduced to one lane. • During working hours, two-way local traffic will be facilitated by the Contractor’s flaggers. • During non-working hours, one way traffic in the westerly direction will be open. • Access to resident driveways on Wright Avenue will be maintained. When your driveway access is impacted, you will receive a notice 48 hours in advance. Residents between Richwood Street to Romanway Crescent may be asked to temporarily park on adjacent side streets when your driveway is impacted. • There will be detour signs in the area to provide motorists with alternate routes.
	<p>Pedestrians: The existing sidewalk on Wright Avenue will be maintained for the duration of the work.</p>
	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.</p>
	<p>TTC Service: This project will affect TTC bus route 79 Scarlett Road and 32C Eglinton West. Route diversions will be in place and bus stops on Wright Ave may not be served or may be relocated. Visit ttc.ca for up to date information.</p>
