
TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE OLD MILL DRIVE AND RIVERSIDE DRIVE

Contract: 20ECS-LU-01FP

Expected Start Date: Wednesday, March 6, 2024 Expected End Date: Friday, March 8, 2024 *Timeline is subject to change

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm and sanitary sewer system in your area in order to reduce surface and basement flooding. Due to the depth and nature of the storm sewer construction work, the road will be closed at the intersection of Old Mill Drive and Riverside Drive effective from 7:00 a.m. on Wednesday, March 6, 2024 to 5:00 p.m. Friday, March 8, 2024. This project is part of the Council-approved 2021 Basement Flooding Protection Program to improve the water distribution system, renew our aging infrastructure and reduce the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups and flooding.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.



Pedestrians: The work may require temporary sidewalk restrictions, however any necessary sidewalk closures will alternate in each direction to ensure pedestrian access is maintained during construction.



Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday to Friday.



Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
