

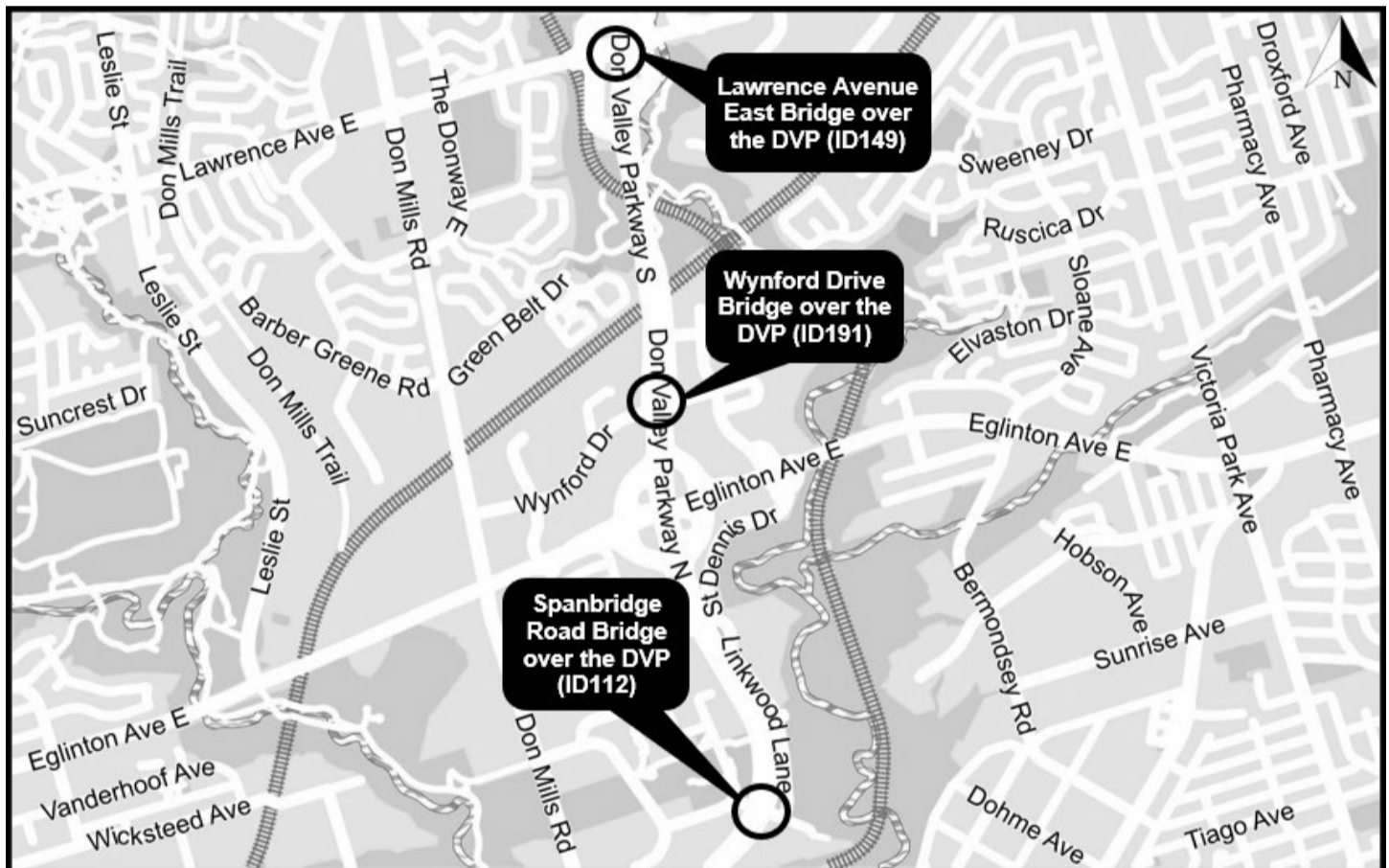

## Spanbridge Road, Lawrence Avenue & Wynford Drive Bridges Rehabilitation over the DVP

**Contract: 23ECS-BE-12BSE**  
**Start Date: April 1, 2024 End Date: October 18, 2024**  
*\*Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto will rehabilitate the Spanbridge Road, Lawrence Avenue, and Wynford Drive Bridges over the Don Valley Parkway (DVP). This work will ensure that the bridges meet today’s standards and remain safe for road users into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2024 Capital Works Program.

### WORK DETAILS

The City’s contractor will:

- Set up work areas and traffic control in the vicinity of the bridge
- Implement nightly lane and ramp closures on the Don Valley Parkway to create a safe work zone
- Clean and paint the existing structural steel on the bridge





Construction will take place in the following stages:

Spanbridge Road over DVP	<b>1A:</b> April 4 to May 27, 2024	Northbound lanes on the DVP	At least one lane will be maintained but up to two lanes may be closed nightly
	<b>1B:</b> April 2 to May 30, 2024	Southbound lanes on the DVP	At least one lane will be maintained but up to two lanes may be closed nightly

Lawrence Avenue East over DVP	<b>2A:</b> April 8 to July 10, 2024	Southbound lanes on the DVP, and intermittent ramp closures	Installation and removal of hanging scaffolding will require nightly lane closures with intermittent nightly ramp closures; At least one lane will be maintained but up to two lanes may be closed nightly. Otherwise, all lanes will be open during construction
	<b>2B:</b> April 10 to August 9, 2024	Northbound lanes on the DVP;	At least one lane will be maintained but up to two lanes may be closed nightly with intermittent nightly ramp closures
Wynford Drive over DVP	<b>3A:</b> April 12 to Sept. 7, 2023	Southbound lanes on the DVP and intermittent ramp closures	At least one lane will be maintained with up to two lanes closed nightly with occasional ramp closures from Lawrence Avenue to SB DVP
	<b>3B:</b> April 16 to Sept. 9, 2023	Northbound lanes on the DVP and ramp closures	At least one lane will be maintained with up to two lanes closed nightly with ramp closures from Eglinton Avenue to NB DVP

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place at night from 11 p.m. to 6 a.m., Monday to Friday. On weekends, the work may take place at night from 11 p.m. to 9 a.m.
	<b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	<b>Traffic Management:</b> There will be nightly ramp and lane closures on the Don Valley Parkway during construction. Traffic in both directions will be maintained on Spanbridge Road, Lawrence Avenue, and Wynford Drive.  Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on the DVP and on nearby main and side streets.
	<b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the <b>Field Ambassador</b> listed below.
