
### Land Acknowledgement

### **Anchor Agency Services & Supports Overview**

- New funding stream approved as part of the 2024 City Budget process
- Three pilot sites
- Focus of the projects are to:
  - Provide one-on-one individualized case management to improve housing stability
  - Community development supports and crisis management supports to the building
  - Support the implementation of a Community Safety Program in select locations determined by the City



#### **Funding and Term**

- The funding available for this pilot is approximately \$3.0 million annually
- The project term is August 1, 2024 to March 31, 2026
- All project proposals are received through the Toronto Grants Rebates and Incentives Portal (TGRIP)
- Materials and application instructions are provided
- Helpdesk sessions for support with TGRIP and the application will be held separately



### **Proposal Content**

- The outcomes and targets are clear and achievable
- The quality of the Work Plan, demonstrating an understanding of the service delivery requirements
- Financial stability and oversight
- Demonstrate experience in collective impact, building community partnerships
- Experience and capacity to work with people with histories of homelessness and housing instability
- Willingness to increase knowledge and skills through participation in training opportunities

### Service Delivery Requirements - Overview

- Core program components:
  - Case management
  - Community development and crisis management
- Data collection and reporting expectations
- Community safety program requirements



### **Support Principles**

- Individualized, flexible and responsive
- Person-centred and client-driven
- Grounded in Housing First, Harm Reduction and Eviction Prevention approaches
- Offer skill-building opportunities to strengthen personal and community resiliency
- Focused on community integration
- Work collaboratively as part of a circle of support
- Contribute to long-term housing stabilization and success



### **Anchor Agency Services & Supports Pilot Sites**

- Services will be delivered on-site in large apartment buildings
- 3 pilot sites selected for this call:

Ward	Area	Units
Ward 1	Etobicoke North	415
Ward 6	York Centre	294
Ward 24/25	Scarborough- Guildwood/Rouge Park	720



## Service Delivery Requirements – Case Management

- Case management services for identified tenants in the building who require housing stability support
- Services to be delivered in person, on-site, and when needed, in tenant's housing units, including after hours and on weekends
- Low-to-medium intensity case management supports case load capacity 1:20-30 per FTE, ability to scale up or down based on individual need
- Client-directed service planning that integrates appropriate referrals to health and other supports



### Service Delivery Requirements – Community Development and Crisis Management

- Complete a needs assessment and develop an inventory of existing services available to tenants
- Develop and implement ongoing programming direct service or through partnerships, available to all tenants
- Coordinate services between other agencies providing supports to tenants
- Develop an on-site reference group to ensure programming meets needs



### Service Delivery Requirements – Data Collection and Reporting Expectations

- Participate in City and housing provider committees and working groups, as required
- Compile, maintain and provide program statistics and submit activity data and program outcomes, as required
- Engage in program evaluation development and process



### Service Delivery Requirements – Community Safety Program

- Identified anchor agency locations will support the implementation of a community safety program through a community safety ambassador team (CSAT)
- CSAT are a more social services-based response to community safety concerns:
  - Regular patrols of assigned areas
  - Direct engagement with individuals
  - o Pick-up of harm reduction paraphernalia



#### **Three Pilot Sites**

Option #1: Ward 1 – Etobicoke North 415 units (312 bachelor, 103 one-bedroom) Approximately 50% seniors, 50% OW/ODSP

Option #2: Ward 6 – York Centre 294 units (215 bachelor, 79 one-bedroom) Almost 60% seniors, approximately 50% OW/ODSP

**Option #3:** Ward 24/25 - Scarborough-Guildwood/Rouge Park 720 units (631 bachelor, 89 one-bedroom) Almost 40% seniors, approximately 50% OW/ODSP



### **Staffing**

- Staff teams must have extensive experience delivering housing support services, a strong understanding of community resources/development, and an understanding of crisis response/de-escalation
- Staffing models should include a dedicated Supervisor, Manager or Team Lead
- Examples of other eligible staff positions include but are not limited to:
  - Housing Follow-Up/Case Worker
  - Community Development Worker
  - Harm Reduction Specialist
  - Peer Worker



### Things to Consider

- Staff-to-client case management ratio is 1:20-30 (low-to-medium level supports)
- Total funding amount across all 3 sites
- The size of the pilot site(s) in your application
- Ability to be flexible to respond to fluctuating and episodic needs






