Project background

The Action Plan for Toronto's Culture Sector will set an ambitious ten-year vision to support culture in Toronto – including supports for artists and organizations, and for all residents to experience culture in the city.

> Definition of culture encompassing all of City/Toronto Arts Council's mandate, to include the arts, museums and heritage sites, and film and entertainment industries

Why now?

- Shift in policy priorities since adoption of the City's last Culture Plan, "Creative Capital Gains" (2011), with key goals of plan achieved, including:
 - ✓ Increasing arts funding by close to 50% since 2012
 - ✓ Establishing two new Local Arts Service Organizations, with the support of the Toronto Arts Foundation
 - ✔ Expanding access to programming outside the downtown core
 - ✔ New supports for music and film industry
- Emerging from the pandemic, culture in Toronto is at a moment of renewal and change. Culture in Toronto is also facing pressing challenges related to affordability and sustainability, and we need an ambitious new plan to help culture thrive.

Vision

How is the plan being developed?

- Comprehensive **sector and jurisdictional research**, completed in partnership with University of Toronto's School of Cities
- Inclusive community engagement process, led by Monumental Projects
- **External advisory panel** of 22 community leaders providing advice on plan development, and strategies for engagement
- Developed alongside new **Action Plan for Toronto's Economy**, and building on findings of other recent City and TAC engagements
