Road Reconstruction and Road Safety Improvements on Millwood Road, Pape Avenue and Donlands Avenue

Contract: 23ECS-RD-14SP

Start Date: Mid-April 2024 End Date: December 2024

**Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto is beginning state-of-good-repair work on Millwood Road, Pape Avenue and Donlands Avenue due to the poor condition of the roads. This project is part of the Council-approved 2024 Capital Works Program to renew aging City roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

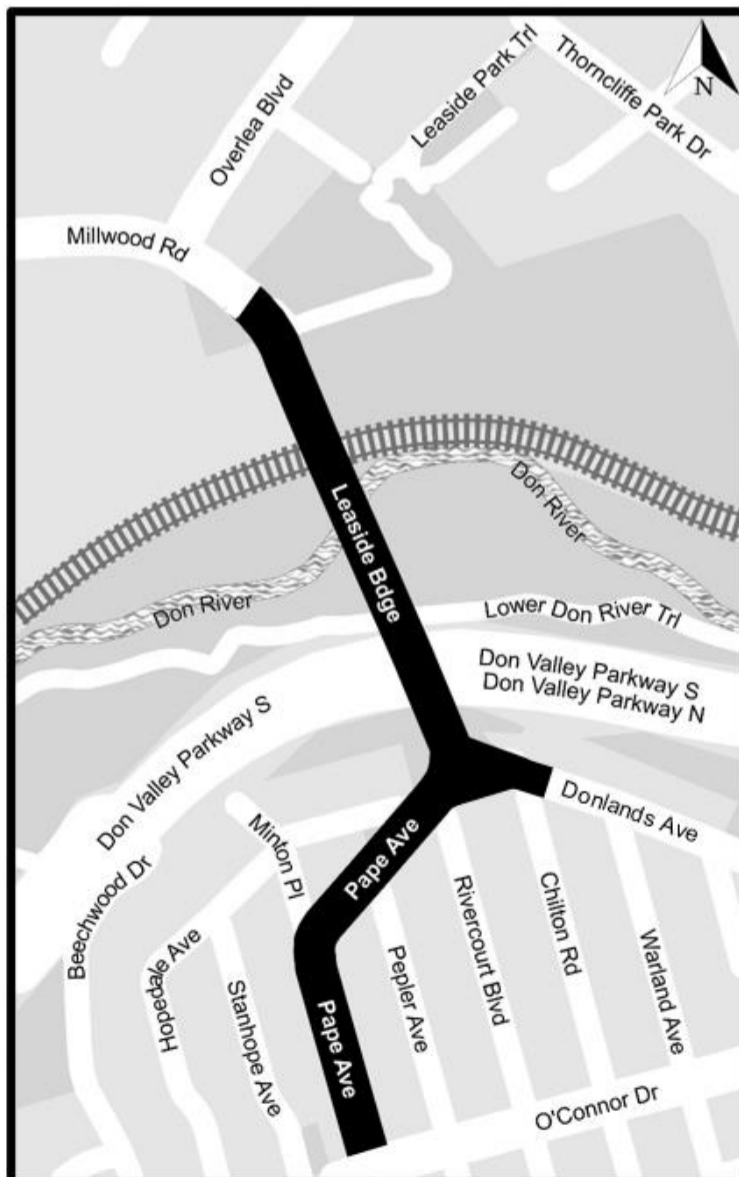
As part of the upcoming work, the City will be making improvements to increase safety and connectivity for all road users. Changes include:

- New separated cycle tracks on Millwood Road (Leaside Bridge) south of Overlea Boulevard;
- New intersection design at Pape Avenue and Donlands Avenue including new pedestrian crossings, new/upgraded bikeways, wider sidewalks and relocated bus stops;
- Changes to the design of several intersections along Pape Avenue.

Work will begin with road resurfacing on Pape Avenue from O'Connor Drive to south of Hopedale Avenue, followed by intersection reconstruction at Pape Avenue and Donlands Avenue.

| Phase 1 – Mid April to Summer Crews will remove and replace the asphalt road surface on Pape Avenue from O’Connor Drive to Hopedale Avenue. Removal and replacement of sidewalk is planned in some segments. | One travel lane in each direction will be maintained along Pape Avenue. TTC bus service will be maintained. Pedestrian access will be maintained. Some driveway access will be temporarily restricted, with advance notice. |
| Phase 2 – Early Summer to late Summer Road Reconstruction at Pape Avenue and Donlands Avenue intersection Crews will remove and reconstruct the road, curbs and sidewalk. | One travel lane in each direction will be maintained along Donlands Avenue and Pape Avenue at the intersection. TTC bus service will be maintained. Pedestrian access will be maintained. Some driveway access will be temporarily restricted, with notice. |
| Phase 2b – Summer Two weekend full intersection closures Crews will remove and replace the concrete road base at the intersection of Pape Avenue, Millwood Road and Donlands Avenue. | The intersection will be fully closed to all vehicles and cyclists from Friday evening to Monday morning for two consecutive weekends. Pedestrian access will be maintained. Transit diversions will be in place. |
| Phase 3 – End of Summer to Fall Cycle track installation on Millwood Road from north of Pape Avenue to 80m south of Overlea Boulevard | One vehicle travel lane in each direction will be maintained along Millwood Road. TTC bus service will be maintained. Pedestrian access will be maintained. |
| Restoration – Fall to December 2024 Crews will restore all areas affected by construction. | Short term travel lane reductions are anticipated. TTC bus service will be maintained. Pedestrian access maintained. |

|  | Work Hours: Work will take place between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with late work or weekend work when needed. All concrete breaking activities will occur between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m. |
|  | Pre-Construction Inspection: GPM, under contract to the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. The inspection will look at the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. Although participation is voluntary, the City encourages all property owners to participate. Without the survey, it will be difficult to confirm any claims of damage caused by construction. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Affected properties will receive a separate notice to set up an appointment. All inspection staff will wear photo I.D. and carry photo equipment for this work. |
|  | Important information for owners of private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage. This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the City representative listed below. |
|  | Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane at some points during the work. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. |

|  | <p>Parking: This work will impact on-street parking. Parking in the work zone will not be permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.</p> |
|  | <p>Parking Violation Notices: Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times. If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date in order to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) or 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction. <p>Please note: Parking violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones).</p> |
|  | <p>Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</p> |
|   | <p>Road and Sidewalk Access: To complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work area. Please watch for signs directing pedestrians. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Affected properties have received additional notification. If your driveway is along Pape Avenue or Donlands Avenue contact the City of Toronto Staff listed below.</p> |
|  | <p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced.</p> |
|  | <p>Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible. Walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the City of Toronto Staff listed below.</p> |
