Start Date: November 2, 2022 Expected End Date: June 2024



This notice provides an update on the rehabilitation of Grubbes Bridge on Albion Road over the West Humber River. Work on this project is currently behind schedule due to unforeseen delays with obtaining necessary approvals from utility companies in the vicinity of the bridge. The City's contractor is working diligently to complete the remainder of the project.

We know this project has an impact to all businesses and residents along Albion Road. We sympathize and appreciate your patience with the dust, noise, fencing and other inconveniences.

WORK STATUS TO DATE

To date, the following work has been completed:

- Repaired concrete retaining walls, pier, and abutment walls including bearing replacements.
- Replaced the bridge superstructure including installation of new concrete girders.
- Reconstructed concrete bridge deck, sidewalk, parapet walls with railings, and approach slabs.

REMAINING WORK

In the coming months, the City's contractor will be completing the following work:

- Installation of new steel beam guide rail and replacement of the bridge deck waterproofing.
- Road reconstruction including new asphalt pavement, joint sealant, and pavement markings.
- Landscaping and restoration works.
