Installation of On-Street Shared Lane Markings in Bathurst Manor

Start Date: June 10, 2024 End Date: June 21, 2024

The City of Toronto is preparing to install on-street shared lane markings on several streets within Bathurst Manor, where people cycling and people driving share the roadway. On-street shared lane markings are painted onto the road and they improve road user awareness and help people cycling navigate the street. There are no impacts to motor vehicle lanes or parking spaces. The City will also refresh existing on-street shared lane markings on Faywood Boulevard.

Project Overview

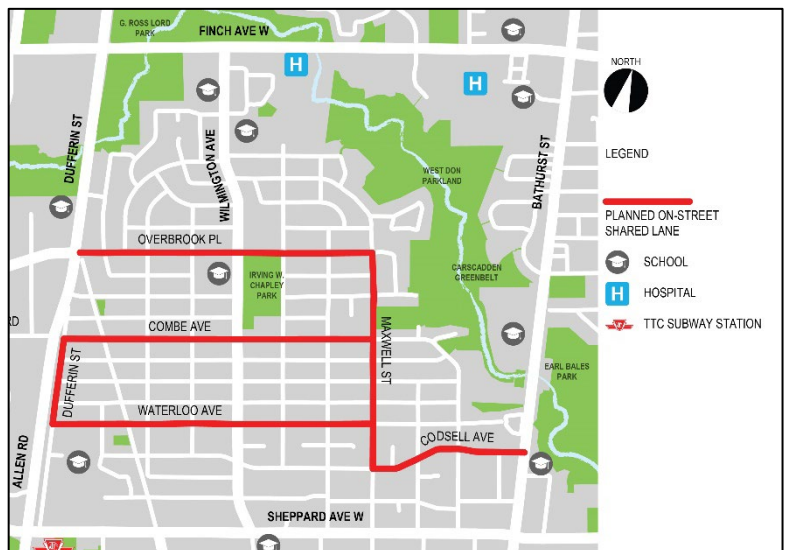
Residents can expect new pavement markings and signage installed within the City’s right-of-way. The pavement markings will include painted bicycle icons and directional arrows to help guide people cycling through the neighbourhood to the nearest recommended cycling routes.

On-street shared lane markings will be installed on:

- Codsell Avenue from Maxwell Street to Bathurst Street
- Combe Avenue from Dufferin Street to Maxwell Street
- Dufferin Street from Combe Avenue to Waterloo Avenue
- Maxwell Street from Overbrook Place to Codsell Avenue
- Overbrook Place from Dufferin Street to Maxwell Street
- Waterloo Avenue from Dufferin Street to Maxwell Street

City services such as Fire, Paramedics and garbage pick-up will continue as usual.

What to Expect During Installation

There may be short periods of noise during installation from leaf blowing equipment to clear the roads of debris before painting. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts of noise and other inconveniences. We appreciate your patience.

During installation, the City’s contractors will complete the following work:

- Prepare the road for lane markings by clearing dirt and debris
- Install new painted pavement markings

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 9 P.M. to 6 A.M. to limit traffic disruptions, Monday to Friday with effort to have the noisiest work complete before 11 P.M.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: No significant delays are expected during construction.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be partial road closures within the work zone. Local access will be maintained. • Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. • Emergency Services: Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	<p>People Cycling: If travelling on any of the affected streets, please share the traffic lane in the active work zones.</p>
	<p>Parking and Loading: Pavement markings will be installed in the middle of the road and will not impact parking or loading. Please park vehicles as close to the curb as possible or on your own property to avoid interference with work trucks.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during installation. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, please inform the contact listed below.</p>
