

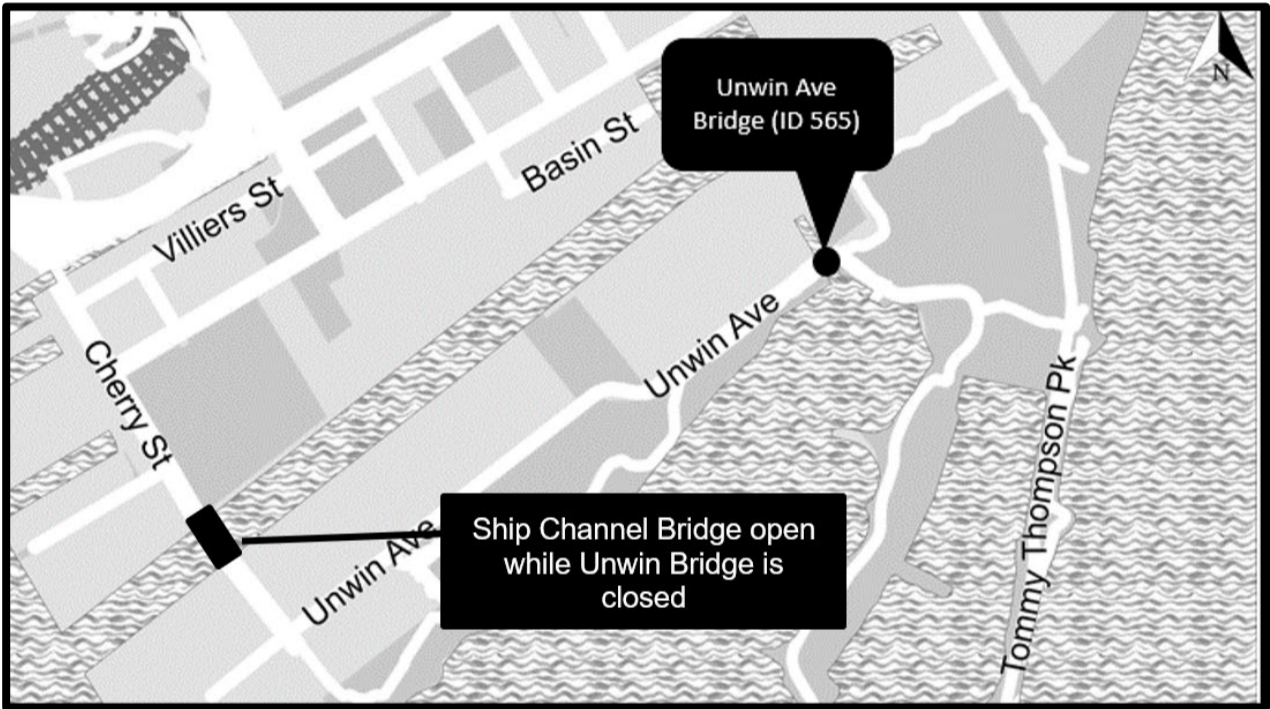

Unwin Avenue Vehicular Bridge Temporary Closure for Repairs

Contract: 24ECS-BE-14SB
Expected Start Date: July 25, 2024
Expected End Date: July 28, 2024
**Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto will rehabilitate the Unwin Avenue Vehicular Bridge located between Leslie St. and Cherry St. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today’s standards and remains safe into the future. During this work, the Unwin Avenue Vehicular Bridge will be closed. However, the Ship Channel Bridge on Cherry Street will remain open for pedestrian and vehicle traffic. Pedestrian and cyclist access will be maintained via the Martin Goodman Trail bridge that is adjacent to the Unwin Avenue Vehicular Bridge. The project is part of the Council-approved 2024 Capital Works Program.

WORK DETAILS

- Repair and refurbish the existing Unwin Avenue Vehicular Bridge.
- Remove and replace the deck panels at each end of the bridge.
- Tightening and replacing bolts on the bridge.
- Replace the waterproofing on the bridge deck.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p>Work Hours and Contingency: Work is expected to take place from July 25 to July 28 from 8 a.m. to as late as 11 p.m. (work will extend to 11 p.m. as necessary and practical). If any portion of the work is not completed due to weather or other complications, it will be rescheduled for after the anticipated completion of the Cherry Street Ship Channel work this summer.</p>
	<p>Access: Motorized vehicles: Unwin Avenue Vehicular Bridge will be closed during the repair work, including overnight. The Ship Channel Bridge on Cherry Street will be open to traffic while the Unwin Bridge is closed.</p>

	<p>Pedestrians and cyclists: The adjacent Martin Goodman Trail bridge will remain open for pedestrians and cyclists. Cyclists are asked to please be aware of traffic movements and obey signs and signals.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Project Manager listed below.</p>
