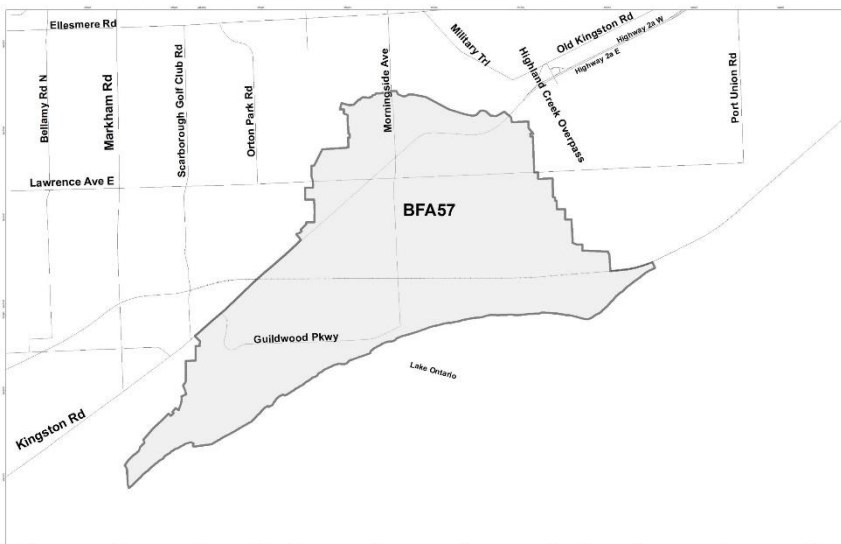


# Basement Flooding Study Area 57

## Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Notice of Study Completion

The City of Toronto has completed a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) study that examines surface and basement flooding within Study Area 57 and identifies improvements that can be made to city infrastructure to reduce the risk of future flooding. The study area is located in the West Hill and Guildwood Parkway area, and has experienced basement and surface flooding during severe rainstorms in the past.



Following consultation, the City is recommending:

- Improving catch basin management (new catchbasins, high-capacity inlets, inlet control devices)
- Upsizing storm and sanitary sewers in the area of Morningside Avenue and Danzig Street
- Upgrading the existing storm sewer outfall to Deekshill Park
- Various storm and sanitary sewer upgrades, and storm outfall reconstructions

The study has been completed following the Master Plan Municipal Class Environmental Assessment process.
