

Brock Avenue Bridge Rehabilitation under Metrolinx Rail

Contract: 24ECS-BE-15PM Start Date: September 2024 End Date: February 2025 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate Brock Avenue Bridge under Metrolinx Rail. This work will ensure that the bridge and road meet today's standards and remain safe into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2024 Capital Works Program.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks, curbs requiring replacement, the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water, and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.

କ ଅ ଅ ଅ ଅ	Access to Your Home: The City-hired contractor may need access to the interior and exterior of your home to complete a pre-construction condition survey. Affected properties will receive a letter about scheduling a time to complete the pre-construction condition survey. Although participation is voluntary, the pre- construction survey results may be useful to confirm claims for potential damage caused by City construction.
Ŀ	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
