

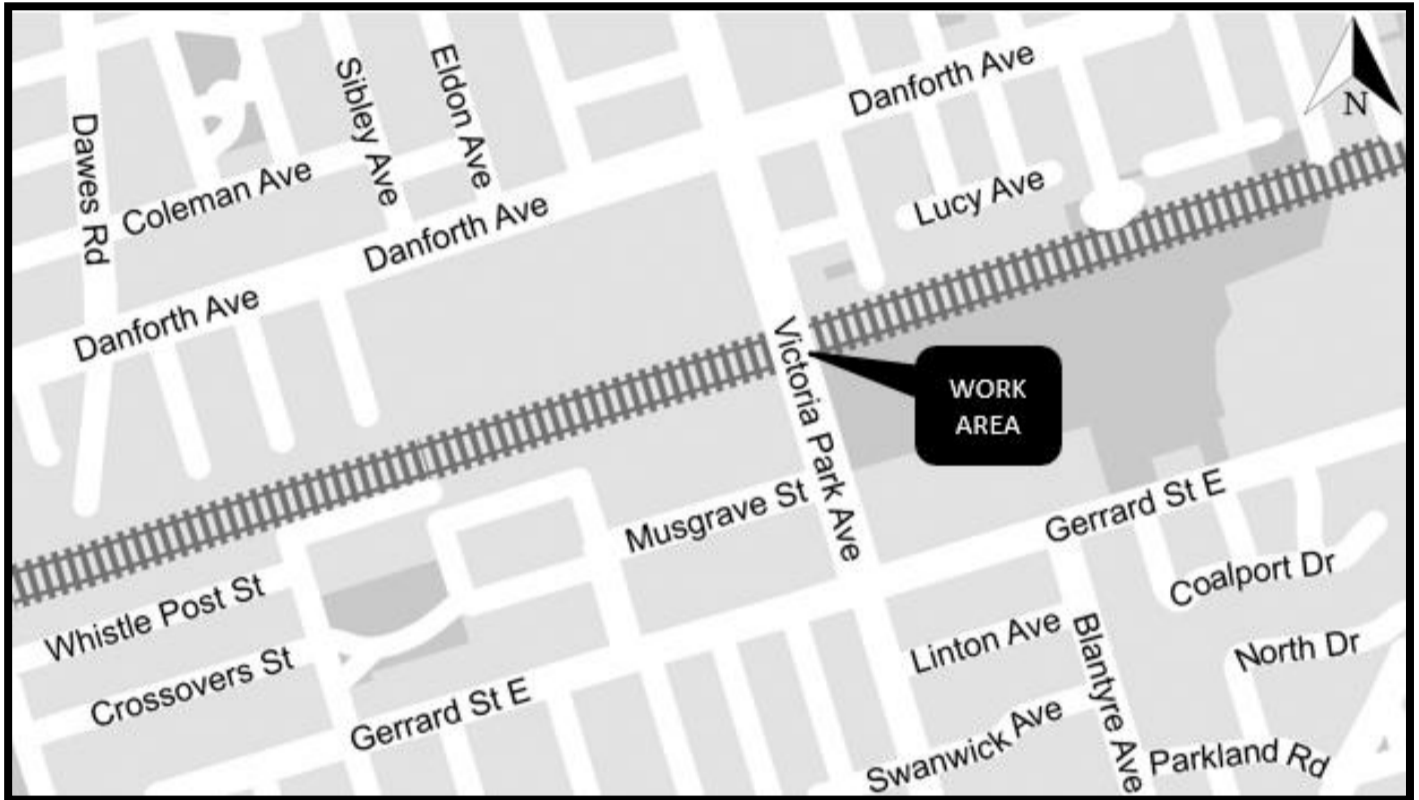

Victoria Park Avenue Bridge Rehabilitation under Metrolinx Rail

Contract: 24ECS-BE-17PM
Start Date: September 2024
End Date: April 2025

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate Victoria Park Avenue bridge under Metrolinx Rail. This work will ensure that the bridge and road meet today’s standards and remain safe into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2024 Capital Works Program.

WORK DETAILS





The City’s contractor will:

- Repair and refurbish Victoria Park Avenue bridge under Metrolinx Rail.
- Replace energy attenuators and concrete sidewalks along with associated curbs at grade.
- Patch repair the concrete deck, soffit, and the substructure (piers, abutments, and retaining walls).
- Replace pack luminaires with junction boxes under the bridge.
- Concrete surface sealing on substructure and sidewalks.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise, and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, and 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., Saturdays. No work will occur on Sundays and Statutory holidays, unless necessary.</p>
	<p>Pre-Construction Inspection: The City hired contractor will conduct inspections of properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Affected properties will receive a separate notice to set up an appointment for the inspection.</p>

	<p>The inspection will look at the exterior and interior of properties to verify existing conditions. Although participation is voluntary, the City encourages all property owners to participate. Without the survey, it will be difficult to confirm any claims of damage caused by construction. All inspection staff will wear photo I.D. and carry photo equipment for this work.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Pedestrians will be redirected from the sidewalk to a pedestrian corridor, which will be accessible at all times. The pedestrian corridor will be ramped, fenced, and protected by a debris screener.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p> <p>Lanes on Victoria Park Avenue will be reduced to one lane in each direction between Musgrave Street and Wakehood Street.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Granular base or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
