## Don Valley Parkway over Royal Drive Pedestrian Bridge Rehabilitation



The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the Don Valley Parkway Pedestrian Bridge over Royal Drive. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe into the future. **The bridge will be closed to pedestrians for the duration of construction.** The project is part of the Council-approved 2024 Capital Works Program

### WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:






- Repair and refurbish the Don Valley Parkway Pedestrian Bridge over Royal Drive.
- Remove existing steel beam guide rails on Royal Road
- Construct new concrete barrier walls and new steel beam guide rails on Royal Road
- Replace steel handrails on the pedestrian bridge
- Reconstruct bridge ballast walls and expansion joints
- Patch repair to the concrete bridge deck and girders, the substructure's piers and abutments
- Replace bridge bearings
- Replace the asphalt surface and waterproofing

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise, and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.



**Work Hours:** Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., Saturdays. No work will occur on Sundays and Statutory holidays

	<p><b>Pre-Construction Inspection:</b> The City hired contractor will conduct inspections of properties within 30 meters of the construction area before construction starts. Affected properties will receive a separate notice to set up an appointment for the inspection.</p> <p>The inspection will look at the exterior and interior of properties to verify existing conditions. Although participation is voluntary, the City encourages all property owners to participate. Without the survey, it will be difficult to confirm any claims of damage caused by construction. All inspection staff will wear photo I.D. and carry photo equipment for this work.</p>
	<p><b>Bridge / Pedestrian / Biking Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, <b>access to the pedestrian bridge will be closed for the duration of construction work.</b></p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p> <p><b>Temporary concrete barriers and pylons will be placed on Royal Drive.</b></p>
	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the <b>Field Ambassador</b> listed below.</p>
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
