Military Trail from Ellesmere Road to Highcastle Road Project Update and Road Closure Notice

Contract: 19ECS-TI-105LR Start Date: September 9, 2024 End Date: Early October 2024 *Timeline is subject to change.

This notice provides an update on the road reconstruction, sidewalk construction and slope stabilization project on Military Trail from Ellesmere Road to Highcastle Road, and rehabilitation of the Military Trail Bridge over Upper East Highland Creek.

Starting the week of September 9, crews will return to address the remaining work on the project, including sidewalk and curb repairs, stone wall repairs, and completing the final paving and line painting.

Site preparation & Phase 1: Starting the week of September 9

Work	 Site preparation will include signage installation, implementing erosion control measures and setting up traffic control measures. 	
	Phase 1 work will focus on concrete curb and sidewalk repairs.	
Traffic impacts	• The road will be reduced to one lane in some locations with flaggers directing traffic to allow vehicles to travel in both directions.	
	 Please use caution and allow extra travel time. 	

Phase 2: Starting as soon as September 16

Work	• Phase 2 work includes repairs to the stone wall, the final coat of asphalt, and	
	the application of the permanent lane markings.	
Traffic impacts	This phase will require a full road closure for approximately 15 days.	

Efforts are being made to complete the work as quickly as possible. Once this work is completed, Military Trail will reopen and this project will be completed. Thank you for your ongoing patience during this project.
