KEY FINDINGS: AQUATIC SPECIES & HABITAT

IMPACTS

 Widening or replacement of bridges at Markham and Malvern Branches of Highland Creek may require in-water works, with the potential for harmful alteration, disruption or destruction (HADD) of fish habitat.

- ✓ Maintain and protect riparian (riverbank) vegetation.
- ✓ Reduce water exposure to soils; control erosion and sediments; protect surface water.
- Avoid contamination of surface water from construction materials.
- ✓ Avoid changes to water quality and quantity.
- Ensure site-specific mitigation measures.







KEY FINDINGS: VEGETATION COMMUNITIES

IMPACTS

- Displacement and Disturbance:
 - Removal of about 10.46 ha of naturalized and human-influenced areas.
- Impact on Rare Vegetation:
 - Disruption to Rare, Threatened, or Endangered Vegetation and Vegetation Communities.
 - Removal of 9.89 ha of human-influenced lands, cultural vegetation communities.
 - Removal of 0.57 ha of wetland communities.

- ✓ Pre-construction: Design to avoid and minimize impact on terrestrial ecosystems; plan for planting of forest and wetland habitat.
- ✓ During construction: Best management practices for vegetation protection.
- ✓ Post-construction: Restoration and Enhancement; Invasive Species Management.







KEY FINDINGS: WILDLIFE AND HABITAT

IMPACTS

- Wildlife habitat removal will be required at Conlins MSF.
- Removal of the following vegetation communities at Conlins MSF and other areas:
 - Cultural Meadow Communities (CUM1-1); Mineral Cultural Woodland (CUW1); Shallow Marsh (MAS2); Deciduous Forest (FOD).
 - majority of FOD community on Rouge River Valley slope likely not impacted
- Overall, limited impact due to previous disturbances to terrestrial wildlife habitat and low habitat structure and diversity in encroached area.

- ✓ Wildlife Sweep: Prior to construction; wildlife to be dispersed from work zone.
- ✓ Wildlife Capture and Transport: Undispersed wildlife to be captured and moved to nearby suitable habitats.
- ✓ Scientific Collectors Permit to be obtained from MNRF for wildlife salvage activities.
- Continuous Monitoring and Adherence to permits to ensure responsible wildlife management.







KEY FINDINGS: SOIL

IMPACTS

- Soil erosion due to construction activity (clearing, excavation, grading, etc).
- Construction activity may cause soil to deposit/settle in watercourses.

- ✓ Standard erosion and sediment control measures as per Ontario Provincial Standard Specification 805 Construction Specification for Temporary Erosion and Sediment Control Measures (2010).
- ✓ Erosion and Sediment Control Plan for site-specific erosion and sedimentation control measures.
- ✓ Compliance with best management practices.

Environmental management plans

- Restoration and Enhancement Plans.
- ✓ Erosion and Sediment Control Plan.
- Environmental Inspection and Monitoring Plan.

Wetlands protection

✓ Further correspondence with TRCA about permits under Ontario Regulation 166/06 and to assess boundaries of wetlands near EELRT.

Self-assessment for harmful alteration, disruption or destruction (HADD) of fish habitat

 Further correspondence with DFO about species at risk and Fisheries Act.

Tree inventory

✓ To be conducted once design permits individual tree impact assessments.

Species at risk protection

✓ Further correspondence with MECP about identified and potential species at risk in study area, and Ontario ESA requirements.

Field investigations

✓ Further work during appropriate seasons using MNRF protocols.


