## Sanitary forcemain replacement on your street

**Contract: 23TW-CTS-14CWD**

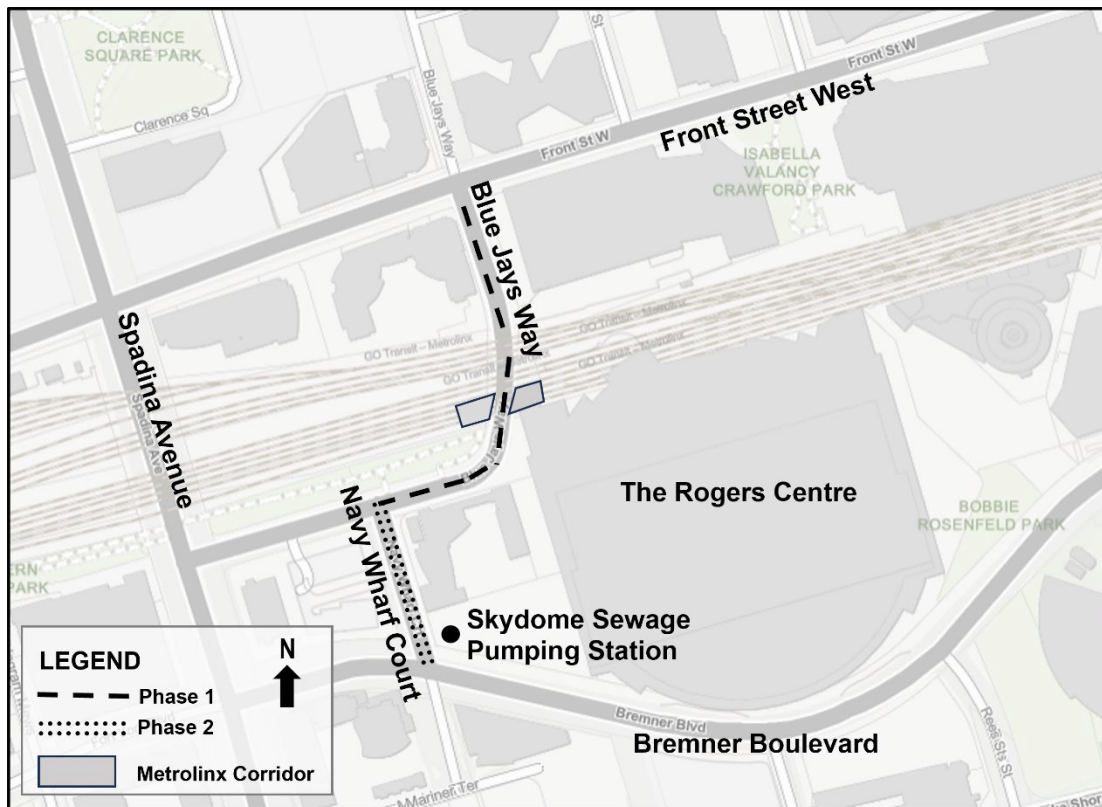
**Phase 2 End Date: August 2025**

The City of Toronto will replace the sanitary forcemain (a pressurized sewer pipe that transports wastewater from a lower to higher elevation) that has reached the end of its life cycle. Work will take place on **Blue Jays Way** south of **Front Street West** to **Navy Wharf Court** and on **Navy Wharf Court** between **Blue Jays Way** and **Bremner Boulevard** and at the **Skydome Sewage Pumping Station**. Please see a map of the work area below.

This project is part of the Council-approved Capital Works Program to renew aging infrastructure reducing the risk of forcemain breaks and collapses.

### WORK DETAILS

In the first few weeks, the City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Construction crews will then:





- Mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cables so that the construction work does not interfere with other utilities.
- During Phase 1, there will be overnight work along the Metrolinx corridor (rail corridor) under Blue Jays Way bridge.
- Incrementally excavate the road and dig a trench to install the new sanitary forcemains.
- Install the new forcemains.
- Cover all open cuts in the road with steel plates when not in construction.
- Work inside the pumping station includes connecting to the existing system.
- When underground works are complete, restore the disturbed roadway areas with temporary asphalt and restore all the other disturbed areas such as the grassed area to its original condition.



## CONSTRUCTION PHASES

<b>Phase 1</b>  November 2024 to April 2025	Planned road closures on Blue Jays Way between Navy Wharf Court and south of Front Street East.  Planned overnight work on the Metrolinx corridor under the Blue Jays Way bridge will not impact traffic.  Driveway access on Blue Jays Way will be maintained.  Pedestrian and bicycle paths will remain open.
<b>Phase 2</b>  July 2025 to August 2025  Navy Wharf Court between Bremner Boulevard and Blue Jays Way	One travel lane in each direction will be maintained on Navy Wharf Court between Bremner Boulevard and Blue Jays Way.  Driveway access on Navy Wharf Court will be maintained.  For a portion of construction, the north intersection of Navy Wharf Court and Bremner Boulevard will be closed to pedestrians. Signage will be put in place advising of the closure.  For a portion of construction, the east intersection of Navy Wharf Court and Bremner Boulevard will be closed to pedestrians. Signage will be put in place advising of the closure.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p><b>Work hours:</b> Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required and in accordance with the City of Toronto's Noise Bylaw. You will be notified in advance of any changes to work hours. The weekday evening work hours allow the City's contractor to complete work for phases 1 and 2 in an expedited way to meet construction deadlines.</p> <p>In Phase 1, there will be overnight work along Blue Jays Way in addition to the work along the Metrolinx corridor under the Blue Jays Way Bridge from 12 a.m. to 6 a.m.</p>
	<p><b>Construction noise:</b> You may experience intermittent noise and vibration during construction (from vacuum trucks, power generators, air compressors, etc.). All work will comply with the City of Toronto's Noise Bylaw.</p>
	<p><b>Road and sidewalk access:</b> To safely complete the work, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Driveway access on Blue Jays Way will be maintained in Phase 1.</li> <li>Driveway access on Navy Wharf Court will be maintained in Phase 2. <b>Access for local residents living on Navy Wharf Court in Phase 2 will be maintained.</b></li> </ul>
	<p><b>Traffic management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p>

	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Permanent restoration of the curb and sidewalk will take place within 18 to 24 months.</p>
	<p><b>Accessible accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
