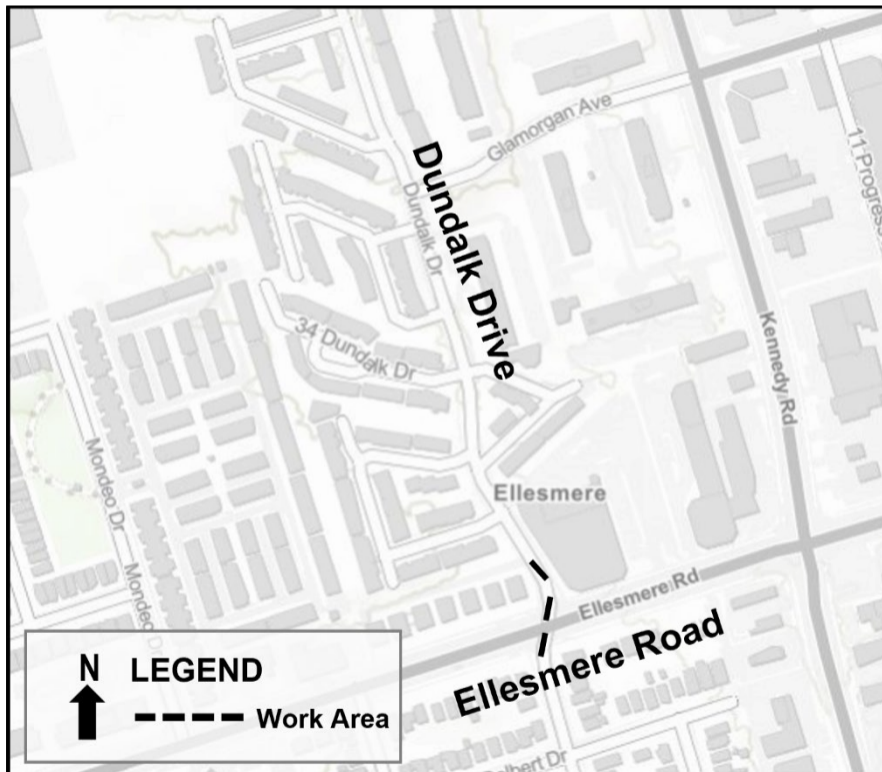
The City of Toronto started cleaning and structurally relining the watermain in your area. Overnight work is required at the intersection of **Dundalk Drive and Ellesmere Road**.

On September 25, 2024, overnight work will begin in the area for one night. This overnight work is required to complete the project on schedule, reduce impacts to traffic and minimize water service disruptions.

This project is part of the Council-approved Capital Works Program to renew our aging infrastructure, improve water distribution and reduce the risk of watermain breaks.

Important information: Impacts on properties and the surrounding area are expected, including planned water shut-offs, excavation and lane closures. The contractor will provide an additional notice at least 48 hours in advance for all planned shut-offs specific to your property.

WORK DETAILS

Construction crews will:

- excavate pits in the road to access the watermain;
- clean and structurally re-line the existing watermain;
- restore all work areas with asphalt, concrete or grass.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences.
- The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 p.m. on September 25 to 5 a.m. on September 26.</p>
	<p>Construction Noise: You may experience intermittent noise and vibration during construction (from vacuum trucks, power generators, air compressors, etc.). All work will comply with the City of Toronto's Noise Bylaw.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p>
	<p>Water service disruptions: From time-to-time, the water supply to your property will need to be shut off to complete construction. The contractor will provide at least 48-hour advance notice for all planned shut-offs. Throughout the work, it is recommended that you temporarily disconnect any water treatment systems (i.e., softeners or filters), water-cooled air conditioners or similar plumbing fixtures.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
