Thank you for contacting the Ministry of Citizenship and Multiculturalism (MCM) about the above-referenced project, which is following the Transit Project Assessment Process (TPAP) as defined in Ontario Regulation 231/08 under the *Environmental Assessment Act*. O. Reg 231/08 identifies the MCM interest in cultural heritage resources. Cultural heritage resources include:

- Archaeological resources, including land and marine;
- Built heritage resources, including bridges and monuments; and,
- Cultural heritage landscapes

Under the TPAP, the proponent is required to consider whether its proposed transit project could have potential negative impact on the environment. Under the process an objection can be submitted to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) about a matter of provincial importance that relates to the natural environment or has cultural heritage value or interest." The MECP expects a transit project proponent to make reasonable efforts to avoid, prevent, mitigate or protect matters of provincial importance.

The MECP's <u>Guide to Environmental Assessment Requirements for Transit Projects (Transit Guide)</u> provides guidance to proponents on how to meet the requirements of O.Reg 231/08. The Transit Guide encourages proponents to obtain information and input from appropriate government agency technical representatives before starting the TPAP to assist in meeting the timelines specified in the regulation, including the submission of a draft Environmental Project Report (EPR) for review and comment prior to issuing a Notice of Commencement.

Among the pre-planning activities outlined in Section 4.1 of the Transit Guide, a proponent is advised to conduct studies to:

identify existing baseline environmental conditions;

Consideration of provincial importance includes properties that meet the criteria set out in O. Reg 9/06.

- identify project-specific location or alignment (including construction staging, land requirements);
 and.
- identify expected environmental impacts and proposed measures to mitigate potential negative impacts.

This letter provides advice on how to incorporate consideration of cultural heritage in the above mentioned pre-planning activities, and also expands on section 3.4 of the Transit Guide by outlining the technical studies and level of detail required to address the cultural heritage component for transit projects that are covered by O.Reg 231/08. The outcomes and recommendations of the studies will be reported in the draft EPR and form the basis for any future commitments outlined in the EPR.

Please note that if the subject lands or part of the subject lands are owned or controlled by an Ontario government ministry or prescribed public body (PPB) on behalf of the Crown (the list of PPBs is available as Ontario Regulation 157/10), a ministry or PPB may have responsibilities under the <u>Standards and Guidelines for Conservation of Provincial Heritage Properties</u> (S&G).

Project Summary

The Eglinton East Light Rail Transit (EELRT), the future Line 7, is a proposed 18 kilometre LRT in Scarborough extending from Kennedy Station (on Line 2 and Line 5) to Malvern Town Centre via the University of Toronto Scarborough Campus (UTSC) with connection at the future station of the provincial Scarborough Subway Extension (SSE) at Sheppard Avenue and McCowan Road.

Identifying Cultural Heritage Resources

While some cultural heritage resources may have already been formally identified, others may be identified through screening and evaluation.

Indigenous communities may have knowledge that can contribute to the identification of cultural heritage resources, and we suggest that any engagement with Indigenous communities includes a discussion about known or potential cultural heritage resources that are of value to them.

Municipal Heritage Committees, historical societies and other local heritage organizations may also have knowledge that contributes to the identification of cultural heritage resources.

Archaeological Resources (Land and Marine, if applicable)

MCM recommends that, as a best practice, a combined Stage 1-2 archaeological assessment (AA) be completed for the entire study area during the pre-planning phase.

At a minimum, a Stage 1 AA will be undertaken for the entire study area during the pre-planning phase. The results of the Stage 1 AA will inform the TPAP and will be summarized in the draft EPR. If the Stage 1 AA recommends further AA(s), then MCM recommends that further stages of AA be completed as early as possible during the planning or design phase of the project, and prior to the completion of detailed design.

Archaeological assessments are required to be undertaken by an archaeologist licenced under the *Ontario Heritage Act*, who is responsible for submitting the report directly to MCM for review.

The EPR must include specific information from the AA report(s). The Executive Summary of each AA report provides a brief summary of the work completed and the recommendations for next steps, whether for further archaeological assessment, in which case the report will include a map that identifies those areas, or for no further assessment. The EPR must also include clear commitments to undertake the recommended AA and a timeline for their completion.

Built Heritage Resources and Cultural Heritage Landscapes

A Cultural Heritage Report: Existing Conditions and Preliminary Impact Assessment will be undertaken for the entire study area during the pre-planning phase to inform the TPAP. This study will:

1. <u>Identify existing baseline cultural heritage conditions</u> within the study area. The consultants preparing the Cultural Heritage Report will need to define a study area and explain their rationale. MCM recommends that the study area for the report include, at minimum, the project footprint and

adjacent properties. Alternatively, the study area may include the project footprint and a study zone that is located immediately beside the footprint and extends a certain distance. The report will include a historical summary of the development of the study area and will identify all known or potential built heritage resources and cultural heritage landscapes in the study area. MCM has developed screening criteria that may assist with this exercise: Criteria for Evaluating for Potential Built Heritage Resources and Cultural Heritage Landscapes.

- 2. <u>Identify preliminary potential project-specific impacts</u> on the known and potential built heritage resources and cultural heritage landscapes that have been identified. The report should include a description of the anticipated impact to each known or potential built heritage resource or cultural heritage landscape that has been identified.
- 3. <u>Propose and recommend measures to avoid or mitigate potential negative impacts</u> to known or potential built heritage resources and cultural heritage landscapes. The proposed mitigation measures are to inform the next steps of project planning and design.

Where a known or potential built heritage resource or cultural heritage landscape may be directly and adversely impacted², and where it has not yet been evaluated for Cultural Heritage Value or Interest (CHVI), completion of a Cultural Heritage Evaluation Report (CHER) is required to fully understand its CHVI and level of significance. The CHER must be completed within the TPAP . If a built heritage resource or cultural heritage landscape is found to be of CHVI, then a Heritage Impact Assessment (HIA) will be undertaken by a qualified person. The HIA will be completed in consultation with MCM and the proponent as early as possible during detail design, following the TPAP.

While some cultural heritage landscapes are contained within individual property boundaries, others span across multiple properties. For certain cultural heritage landscapes, it will be more appropriate for the CHER and HIA to include multiple properties, in order to reflect the extent of that cultural heritage landscape in its entirety.

More detailed advice on how to document some of the information above is attached to this letter.

Technical cultural heritage studies will be undertaken by a qualified person who has expertise, recent experience, and knowledge relevant to the type of cultural heritage resources being considered and the nature of the activity being proposed.

The findings of the above-mentioned studies should be summarized as part of the EPR discussion of existing conditions, impact assessment, mitigation, and future commitments. Commitments for further studies should clearly state what is to be done, who is responsible for implementation, and when.

(Draft) Environmental Project Report

The draft EPR should be shared with MCM before the Notice of Commencement of the TPAP process, so that the ministry may review and provide input. We also included the advice in this letter in the Comment Tracker.

Please note that the responsibility for administration of the Ontario Heritage Act and matters related to cultural heritage recently transferred from the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport (MTCS) to the Ministry of Citizenship and Multiculturalism (MCM). Individual staff roles and contact information remain unchanged. Please continue to send any notices, report and/or documentation to both Karla Barboza and Dan Minkin:

² A direct adverse impact would have a permanent and irreversible negative effect on the cultural heritage value or interest of a property or result in the loss of a heritage attribute on all or part of the property. Examples include, but are not limited to: removal or demolition of a heritage attribute, land disturbance, alterations that are not sympathetic to the CHVI of the property, introduction of new elements that diminish the integrity of the property, changing the character of the property, intensification of the property without conservation of heritage attributes.

Good afternoon Karla,

Thank you for your response. We were proposing a 25 metre buffer from the proposed alignment, which is for the most part in the existing ROW. After reviewing the study area further and to ensure that we capture all adjacent properties adequately, we will expand to 50 m from the proposed alignment and 50 m buffer around any specific project components, such as the proposed maintenance storage facility site. Our rationale as to why this is appropriate is as follows (and will be included in the reporting):

This study area been defined as inclusive of those lands that may contain built heritage resources or cultural heritage landscapes that may be subject to direct or indirect impacts as a result of the proposed undertaking. All adjacent properties to the project will be captured in the assessment and potential direct and indirect impacts sufficiently addressed. This study area is considered appropriate for the urban environment that the project alignment passes through, and given the proposed infrastructure improvements will be largely contained within the existing right-of-way.

Hi Lindsay (et al.),

Please accept my apologies for this late response.

As you may know, the Ministry developed screening checklists to assist property owners, developers, consultants and others to identify known and potential cultural heritage resources:

- Criteria for Evaluating Archaeological Potential
- Criteria for Evaluating Marine Archaeological Potential
- Criteria for Evaluating Potential for Built Heritage Resources and Cultural Heritage Landscapes

I have used the document above (Built Heritage and Cultural Heritage Landscapes) in order to respond to your question:

- Question 3a. i. Is the property (or project area) identified, designated or otherwise protected under the Ontario
 Heritage Act as being of cultural heritage value e.g. a property that is designated by order of the Minister of
 Citizenship and Multiculturalism as being of cultural heritage value or interest of provincial significance [s.34.5]?
 MCM Response: To date, no properties have been designated by the Minister.
- Question 3a.v. Is the property (or project area) identified, designated or otherwise protected under the Ontario Heritage Act as being of cultural heritage value included in the Ministry of Citizenship and Multiculturalism's list of provincial heritage properties?
 - *MCM Response*: Based on the attached Figure 1, we understand that the study area will be along Eglinton Ave East, Kingston Road, Morningside Ave, UofT Scarborough Campus, Sheppard Avenue East. At this time, we are not aware of any provincial heritage properties within or adjacent to the study area.

Please note that if the subject lands or parts of the subject lands are owned or controlled by an Ontario Ministry or Prescribed Public Body (PPB) on behalf of the Crown (the list of PPBs is available as O. Reg. 157/10), a Ministry or PPB may have responsibilities under the <u>Standards and Guidelines for Conservation of Provincial Heritage</u> Properties.

We usually advise that the consultants preparing the Cultural Heritage Report will need to define a study area and explain their rationale. MCM recommends that the study area for the report include, at minimum, the project footprint and adjacent properties. Alternatively, the study area may include the project footprint and a study zone that is located immediately beside the footprint and extends a certain distance. We also included the MTO's approach to their project study area in our examples document. It is not clear whether the proposed approach of using the project alignment and applying a 25 m buffer to either side would also include the existing right-of-way plus 25m buffer. You may also want to look into previous Cultural Heritage Reports prepared for TPAPs, e.g., Stage 2 iON LRT, City of London BRT, <u>Dundas BRT Mississauga East</u> (ROW plus 50m to either side). Please include the rationale of the proposed approach.

MCM would appreciate if the Cultural Heritage Report be sent for our review and comment prior to the issuance of any notice of commencement.

Thank you for circulating the draft Project File Report (PFR) for the above-referenced project to the Ministry of Citizenship and Multiculturalism (MCM) for review and comment. We understand that this project is following the Transit Project Assessment Process (TPAP) as defined in Ontario Regulation 231/08 under the *Environmental Assessment Act*. O. Reg 231/08 identifies the MCM's interest in cultural heritage resources. Cultural heritage resources include:

- Archaeological resources, including land and marine;
- Built heritage resources, including bridges and monuments; and,
- Cultural heritage landscapes

Under the TPAP, the proponent is required to consider whether its proposed transit project could have potential negative impact on the environment. Under the process an objection can be submitted to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) about a matter of provincial importance that relates to the natural environment or has cultural heritage value or interest (CHVI). The MECP expects a transit project proponent to make reasonable efforts to avoid, prevent, mitigate or protect matters of provincial importance.

Project Summary

The Eglinton East Light Rail Transit (EELRT), the future Line 7, is a proposed 18 kilometre LRT in Scarborough extending from Kennedy Station (on Line 2 and Line 5) to Malvern Town Centre via the University of Toronto Scarborough Campus (UTSC) with connection at the future station of the provincial Scarborough Subway Extension (SSE) at Sheppard Avenue and McCowan Road.

¹ The MECP's *Guide to Environmental Assessment Requirements for Transit Projects* states that "when dealing with any property of cultural heritage value or interest, "provincial importance" is not restricted to property meeting the criteria as set out under the *Ontario Heritage Act* in *Ontario Regulation 10/06*, Criteria for Determining Cultural Heritage Value or Interest of Provincial Significance." Consideration of provincial importance includes properties that meet the criteria set out in O. Reg 9/06.

Comments

We have reviewed the following documents:

- Draft Environmental Project Report: Eglinton East Light Rail Transit Project, dated March 4, 2024, prepared by the City of Toronto and the TCC ("EPR"); and
- Cultural Heritage Report: Existing Conditions and Preliminary Impact Assessment dated May 2023 (updated August/September 2023, January, and February 2024), prepared by ASI and included as Appendix F to the draft EPR.

We have the following comments and observations, in addition to detailed comments in the table below.

The draft EPR and Cultural Heritage Report are generally consistent with MCM's and MECP's guidance, policies and best practices.

Archaeological Resources

Our records indicate that the Stage 1 Archaeological Assessment (under Project Information Form # P094-0367-2023, included as Appendix G of the draft EPR) has yet to be submitted by the licensed archaeologist to MCM.

Please note that archaeological concerns have not been fully addressed until reports have been entered into the Ontario Public Register of Archaeological Reports where those reports recommend that:

- 1. the archaeological assessment of the project area is complete, and
- 2. all archaeological sites identified by the assessment are either of no further cultural heritage value or interest (as per Section 48(3) of the *Ontario Heritage Act*) or that mitigation of impacts has been accomplished through excavation or an avoidance and protection strategy.

Proponents should wait to receive the MCM's review letter indicating that the report(s) has been entered into the Register before issuing a decision or proceeding with any ground disturbing activities.

Proponents must follow the recommendations of the archaeological assessment report(s). MCM recommends that further stages of archaeological assessment be undertaken as early as possible in the EA or detailed design process and prior to any ground disturbing activities.

We strongly recommend that the licensed archaeologist submit the report as soon as possible, and that its findings be considered preliminary until a final version has been entered into the Register.

Built Heritage Resources and Cultural Heritage Landscapes

The Cultural Heritage Report identifies a potential built heritage resource and a potential cultural heritage landscape that will be subject to direct impacts, and therefore require a resource-specific Cultural Heritage Evaluation Report (CHER) to determine whether they are of cultural heritage value or interest (CHVI). As noted in our letter of December 12, 2022, where a known or potential built heritage resource or cultural heritage landscape may be directly and adversely impacted, and where it has not yet been evaluated for CHVI, the CHER must be completed within the TPAP. This guidance is reflected in Recommendation #3 found in Section 8.3 of the Cultural Heritage Report. As such, the drafting of the EPR should assume that these CHERs will be completed by the time the final version of the EPR is submitted.

Thank you for consulting MCM on this project and please continue to do so throughout the TPAP process. If you have any questions or require clarification, please do not hesitate to contact me.

The Funeral, Burial and Cremation Services Act, 2002, S.O. 2002, c.33 requires that any person discovering human remains must cease all activities immediately and notify the police or coroner. If the coroner does not suspect foul play in the disposition of the remains, in accordance with Ontario Regulation 30/11 the coroner shall notify the Registrar, Ontario Ministry of Public and Business Service Delivery, which administers provisions of that Act related to burial sites. 3.	p. 182 4.5.2 Archaeological Resources p. 185	The subsections of this section reproduce more information from the Stage 1 Archaeological Assessment than is necessary and recommended to include in the body of the EPR. The Existing Conditions section on archaeological resources should briefly summarize the methods and findings of the archaeological assessment; it does not need to include the historical and geological background presented in the archaeological report. We suggest deleting Sections 4.5.2.2 and 4.5.2.3, except for the findings at the end of 4.5.2.3. These could be expanded upon to include the specific findings summarized in Section 3.1 of the Stage 1 Archaeological Assessment. We suggest the following format: A Stage 1 archaeological assessment was undertaken on [date] by [consultant archaeologist] for [property or study area]. A Stage 1 AA consists of a review of geographic, land use and historical information for the property and the relevant surrounding area, a property visit to inspect its current condition and contacting MCM to find out whether, or not, there are any known archaeological sites on or near the property. We offer the following sample text: Should it be determined that there is no other technically feasible option than to encroach on to this property, a HIA will be undertaken by a qualified person as early as possible during detailed design, and developed in consultation with, and submitted for review to, the MCM and interested parties including the municipal heritage planner and/or municipal heritage

		committee and Indigenous Nations, as appropriate. A heritage permit may be required and further consultation with heritage staff at the municipality is recommended.
		As noted in the letter above, we reiterate that where potential resources are to be directly impacted, the CHER is to be completed during the TPAP phase.

		We recommend that the following paragraphs be added to the section where appropriate:
		The Stage 2 archaeological assessment, and any further stages of archaeological assessment recommended in the Stage 2 report, will be undertaken by an archaeologist licenced under the OHA as early as possible during the detailed design process and prior to any ground-disturbing activities.
		Should previously undocumented archaeological resources be discovered during construction, the person discovering the archaeological resources shall cease alteration of the site immediately and engage a licensed consultant archaeologist to carry out an archaeological assessment, in compliance with Section 48(1) of the OHA. If the discovery includes human remains, the police or coroner shall also be notified.
6.	6.4 Future Communications and Engagement	The fifth bullet in this section should be revised to reflect our comment #4 regarding Section 5.5.1, with respect to the timing of CHER and HIA completion and review.
7.	7 Permits and Approvals p. 267	We suggest renaming this section "Permits, Approvals and Legislative Requirements" to capture things such as archaeological assessment review, which is triggered by legislation but is not a permit or approval per se (see comment below re Section 7.2).
8.	7.2 Provincial p. 268	MCM does not issue "approvals" for archaeological assessments or cultural heritage reports. We recommend that a bullet with respect to archaeological assessment be worded as follows:
		Obtain letters from MCM indicating that all Archaeological Assessment reports have been entered into the Ontario Public Register of Archaeological Reports, including reports that recommend no further stages of archaeological assessment for each property.
		A separate bullet could be added for the circulation of CHERs and HIAs completed pursuant the Cultural Heritage Report to MCM for review and comment.
9.	7.3 Municipal p. 269	The project may also require approvals from the City for alterations to properties designated by bylaw pursuant to Part IV of the OHA.
10.	Table 8.1 Commitments to Future Work	As noted in item #1 above, references to MHSTCI should be changed to MCM. In the two Cultural Environment rows of Table 8.1, in the "Agencies to be Consulted" column, this will also mean removing duplication, as there should not be two separate ministries indicated.

Table 8.1 Commitments to Future Work Row – Archaeological Resources p. 280	It is unclear why "Indigenous Nations" appears under "Agencies to be Consulted" for the Built Heritage Resources and Cultural Heritage Landscapes row but not the Archaeological Resources row, especially given that "engagement with Indigenous Nations" is mentioned under "Future Commitment" in the Archaeological Resources row. The <i>Standards and Guidelines for Consultant Archaeologists</i> require that Indigenous communities be engaged at Stage 3 at the latest where identified archaeological sites are associated with their cultures, and Section 6.2.3 of the draft EPR notes that the Mississaugas of the New Credit requested to be included in site work associated with the Stage 2 assessment.
12.	Table 8.1 Commitments to Future Work Row – Archaeological Resources p. 280	As with Section 5.5.2 per our comment # 5, this row should note the possibility of additional stages of archaeological assessment that may be triggered by the results of the Stage 2 archaeological assessment, and the procedure in case of archaeological resources being discovered during construction. Further, while we recognize that the "Project Phase" field indicates "Preliminary and Detailed Design", we recommend that the commitment itself note that all required stages remaining at the time of TPAP completion take place as early as possible in the detailed design process, and well in advance of ground-disturbing activities.

Table 1: Inventory of Known and Potential Built Heritage Resources and Cultural Heritage Landscapes within the Study Area p. 74	In the case of built heritage resources and cultural heritage landscapes that were identified during background research and field review, we recommend that the language of the "Description of Property and Known or Potential C.H.V.I." be revised to refer more specifically to one or more of the CHVI criteria found in Ontario Regulation 9/06, for example noting that a resource may be a representative example of a certain style, etc.
14.	Table 2: Preliminary Impact Assessment and Recommended Mitigation Measures Row – B.H.R. 3 p. 100	The direct impacts noted here include the potential to impact views to and from the BHR, and the potential to impact its setting through the addition of the landscaped tree planter. Impacts to views and settings are typically assessed as indirect impacts. It is unclear why they are considered direct impacts here.

Thank you for circulating the Notice of Commencement for the above-referenced project to the Ministry of Citizenship and Multiculturalism (MCM). We understand that this project is following the Transit and Rail Project Assessment Process (TRPAP) as defined in Ontario Regulation 231/08 under the *Environmental Assessment Act*. O. Reg 231/08 identifies the MCM's interest in cultural heritage resources. Cultural heritage resources include:

- Archaeological resources, including land and marine;
- Built heritage resources, including bridges and monuments; and,
- Cultural heritage landscapes

Under the TRPAP, the proponent is required to consider whether its proposed transit project could have potential negative impact on the environment. Under the process, an objection can be submitted to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) about a matter of provincial importance that relates to the natural environment or has cultural heritage value or interest (CHVI). The MECP expects a transit project proponent to make reasonable efforts to avoid, prevent, mitigate or protect matters of provincial importance.

Project Summary

The Eglinton East Light Rail Transit (EELRT), the future Line 7, is a proposed 18 kilometre LRT in Scarborough extending from Kennedy Station (on Line 2 and Line 5) to Malvern Town Centre via the University of Toronto Scarborough Campus (UTSC) with connection at the future station of the provincial Scarborough Subway Extension (SSE) at Sheppard Avenue and McCowan Road.

¹ The MECP's *Guide to Environmental Assessment Requirements for Transit Projects* states that "when dealing with any property of cultural heritage value or interest, "provincial importance" is not restricted to property meeting the criteria as set out under the *Ontario Heritage Act* in *Ontario Regulation 10/06*, Criteria for Determining Cultural Heritage Value or Interest of Provincial Significance." Consideration of provincial importance includes properties that meet the criteria set out in O. Reg 9/06.

Comments

We have reviewed the following documents:

- Draft Environmental Project Report: Eglinton East Light Rail Transit Project, dated May 2024, prepared by the City of Toronto and the TCC ("EPR"); and
- Cultural Heritage Report: Existing Conditions and Preliminary Impact Assessment dated May 2023 (updated August/September 2023, January, February, and May 2024), prepared by ASI and included as Appendix F to the draft EPR.

We have the following comments:

On April 4, 2024, we provided comments on the March 4, 2024 draft of the EPR and the February 2024 draft of the Cultural Heritage Report. Upon review, we find that our comments have been substantially addressed in the updated versions. We have included some further comments on the revised documents in the comment-response table below.

Our comments are made with the understanding that the Cultural Heritage Evaluation Reports for directly impacted potential built heritage resources and/or cultural heritage landscapes, the preliminary results of which are now reflected in the draft EPR, will be finalized by the time the EPR is finalized and the TRPAP completed.

We further find that the draft EPR and Cultural Heritage Report are generally consistent with MCM's and MECP's guidance, policies and best practices.

As noted in our letter of April 4, our records indicate that the Stage 1 Archaeological Assessment (under Project Information Form # P094-0367-2023, included as Appendix G of the draft EPR) has still not to be submitted by the licensed archaeologist to MCM.

We continue to strongly recommend that the licensed archaeologist submit the report to MCM under the standard process as soon as possible, so that review and entry into the Ontario Public Register of Archaeological Resources can take place on a timeline consistent with the project schedule. For the same reason, the project team may wish to have the licensed archaeologist request an expedited review of the report at the time of submission. Findings in the report should be considered preliminary until a final version has been entered into the Register.

Thank you for consulting MCM on this project and please continue to do so throughout the TRPAP process. If you have any questions or require clarification, please do not hesitate to contact me.

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Should previously undocumented archaeological resources be discovered, they may be a new archaeological site and therefore subject to Section 48(1) of the *Ontario Heritage Act*. The proponent or person discovering the archaeological resources must cease alteration of the site immediately and engage a licensed consultant archaeologist to carry out an archaeological assessment, in compliance with Section 48(1) of the *Ontario Heritage Act*.

The Funeral, Burial and Cremation Services Act, 2002, S.O. 2002, c.33 requires that any person discovering human remains must cease all activities immediately and notify the police or coroner. If the coroner does not suspect foul play in the disposition of the remains, in accordance with Ontario Regulation 30/11 the coroner shall notify the Registrar, Ontario Ministry of Public and Business Service Delivery, which administers provisions of that Act related to burial sites. In situations where human remains are associated with archaeological resources, the Ministry of Citizenship and Multiculturalism should also be notified (at archaeology@ontario.ca) to ensure that the archaeological site is not subject to unlicensed alterations which would be a contravention of the Ontario Heritage Act.

Hi Adam, thank you for sending me the TAC meeting minutes. I was on leave at the time of the meeting, but my colleague Liam Smythe attended in my stead.

I notice there was a comment made in response to a question that the "target launch date" is in Spring 2024. Does this refer to the Notice of Commencement or to the circulation of the draft EPR before the Notice of Commencement?

To date we have not received a draft Cultural Heritage Report, and the Stage 1 Archaeological Assessment report under PIF # P094-0367-2023 has not been submitted to our Archaeology Program Unit for review. I am lead to believe that both reports have been drafted.

As noted in our letter of April 6, 2023, the Stage 1 Archaeological Assessment Report should be entered into the Ontario Public Register of Archaeological Reports before completion of the TPAP. This happens after the report has been reviewed by our ministry and revised as necessary, and review can take time. We would recommend that the consultant archaeologist in charge of this report submit it through their professional channels as soon as possible.

As also noted in the same April 6, 2023 letter, we would like to review a draft of the Cultural Heritage Report before the draft EPR is circulated. When would this be possible?

I notice there was a comment made in response to a question that the "target launch date" is in Spring 2024. Does this refer to the Notice of Commencement or to the circulation of the draft EPR before the Notice of Commencement?

In response to your request for review of the Draft Environmental Project Report (EPR) for the Eglinton East LRT, Conservation and Source Protection Branch (CSPB) offers the following comments.

The Eglinton East LRT study area is located in the Toronto Region Source Protection Area is therefore subject to the approved CTC Source Protection Plan. The transit project is eligible under O. Reg. 231/08 to proceed through the Transit Project Assessment Process (TPAP) instead of the full environmental assessment process through Part II of the Environmental Assessment Act.

The study area is located in the intake protection zones (IPZ) 2 and 3 for the F.J. Horgan Water System (see maps below), and the maximum vulnerability score is 4.5. It is also located in a highly vulnerable aquifer. Portions of the project also intersect with a vulnerable area known as an event-based area, which is delineated where modeling has shown that spills from fuel oil pipeline breaks could impact the quality of water at the drinking water intakes. Although the preferred alternative is located in these surface water intake protection zones, transit projects and activities associated with normal operations of the Eglinton East LRT Extension are not considered threats under the Clean Water Act.

While the normal operation phase of the project may not pose a significant threat to sources of drinking water, activities could pose a risk during the construction phase of the project. This means activities can be identified as low or moderate threats to drinking water and source protection plan policies may apply. Particular attention should be paid if the relocation of any fuel oil pipelines is necessary during construction. Activities during the construction or maintenance phases of the project that may pose a moderate or low risk to sources of drinking water include: the

storage and application of road salt; the storage of snow; the handling and storage of fuel; the handling, storage and application of pesticides and fertilizers; the handling and storage of organic solvents and dense non-aqueous phase liquids (DNAPLs).

In the Draft EPR for the Eglinton East LRT Extension, the proponent has not discussed the protection of drinking water sources. The EPR should identify that the project would be occurring within the Toronto Region Source Protection Area, and that the CTC Source Protection Plan applies. The EPR should also identify whether any policies apply to activities related to the construction, operation, or maintenance of the project. The EPR should note whether the proponent has discussed the project with the CTC Source Protection Authority.

CSPB notes that the draft EPR proposes spill prevention and response measures for fuel and chemical handling and storage, dewatering management plans, as well as mitigation of possible impacts to aquatic and terrestrial environments. These measures may also mitigate risks to sources of drinking water and should be discussed in the EPR. Where an activity poses a risk to drinking water, the proponent must document and discuss how the project adheres to, or has regard to, any applicable policies in the CTC source protection plan. The policies should be listed and include any mitigation measures that may be proposed. While the EPR identifies possible fuel and chemical activities that may occur during construction, it is missing reference to any corresponding source protection plan policies.

If they have not done so already, the proponent should contact the Project Manager for drinking water source protection at the CTC Source Protection Authority. The Source Protection Authority (SPA) can provide proponents with assistance in determining whether an activity associated with the construction or operation of the project may be considered a drinking water threat as per the *Clean Water Act*, 2006. The SPA will be able to help determine whether there are policies in the source protection plan that may apply. Even if the project activities in a vulnerable area are deemed to not to be significant threats to drinking water, there may be other low and moderate threat policies that apply, therefore consultation with the local source protection authority is important.

Central Region Technical Support unit was asked by Environmental Approvals Branch (EAB) to provide a memorandum regarding documents providing supporting materials for the New Transit Project Review of Eglinton East LRT.

The following are comments based on hydrogeological information provided in the above noted reports. It is noted that neither of these reports appear to have discussed the hydrogeology of the proposed Eglinton East Light Rail Transit Project and as I am a hydrogeologist and not a geotechnical engineer, I am not qualified to comment on Geotechnical Issues discussed in the Peto MacCallum Ltd. Report. As a hydrogeologist working at Central Region Technical Support

of the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks I can provide the following comments:

- 1. The City of Toronto/ TTC should be prepared to apply for either Environmental Activity and Sector Registry (EASRs) or Permits to take Water (PTTWs) in areas where they anticipate lowering the groundwater levels to below elevations of proposed foundation footings.
- 2. The Peto MacCallum Ltd. (Peto) indicated there was the potential for fill to be encountered in some areas (Peto, Section 7, p.8) and this fill may be unsuitable for foundations. It should be noted that many of the ravines on Toronto were partially filled with waste historically, so these fill materials may also be unsuitable to support foundation footings.

The following memorandum summarizes the Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks Central Region Technical Support Section (TSS) Air Unit's comments on Sections 4.6.1 and 5.6.1 of the *Eglinton East LRT Environmental Project Report (the EPR)*, dated March 4, 2024, and Appendix H of the EPR - *Air Quality Assessment Draft Report (the AQA Report)*, dated February 13, 2024.

The following are TSS air review comments and recommendations on the sections of the reports noted above. The proponent should update relevant sections in the EPR where appropriate when addressing these comments on Appendix H of the EPR.

- Please identify contaminated areas along the proposed route and add a discussion in both the AQA and the EPR reports. If any contamination is present, an ambient monitoring program should be considered to address impacts at nearby receptors.
- 2. A few typos were noted in Table 2 of the AQA Report: The 1hr SO₂ AAQC should be 106 ug/m³ instead of 100 ug/m³; the annual SO₂ AAQC should be 10.6 ug/m³ instead of 10 ug/m³; the 1hr SO₂ CAAQS should be 65 ppb instead of 64 ppb; the 1hr Acrolein AAQC should be 4.5 ug/m³ instead of 4.4 ug/m³. Please revise accordingly.
- 3. Please provide supporting documentation for the traffic data used in Section 6.2 of the AQA Report.
- The meteorological data used for the dispersion modelling from year 1996 to 2000 is outdated. Please use updated versions of the meteorological data for future assessments.

5. Please clarify in Section 7.2 of the AQA report whether welding and soldering activities are expected to take place within the Maintenance and Storage Facility, and if so, whether these activities will cause air emission concerns.



The Transit and Rail Project Assessment Process (TRPAP), defined in Ontario Regulation 231/08, is a streamlined Environmental Assessment process for transit and rail projects. A TRPAP is an up-to-185-day process required for any project establishing a new transit line, which applies to EELRT.

Ahead of the TRPAP, an Environmental Project Report (EPR) has been prepared to document the alignment (route) of the project, stop locations, and preferred design. The EPR also summarizes potential impacts the project may have on the surrounding community and ways to mitigate or minimize those impacts.



- The study area is located in the intake protection zones (IPZ) 2 and 3 (event-based area EBA) for the F.J. Horgan Water System
- Maximum vulnerability score is 4.5
- Coordination with MECP indicated that, transit projects and activities associated with normal operations
 of the Eglinton East LRT are not considered threats under the Clean Water Act.

Stormwater Management Mitigation Measures

The recommended low impact development (LID) / best management practice options for stormwater management include:

- Bioretention cells to provide quality control, which could be tree planters or landscaping with a trench filled with compacted soil underneath the roadway boulevard areas
- Online storage pipes to provide quantity control such as oversized storage pipes with flow control devices
 upstream of the discharge location to provide peak flow control in combination with allowable surface ponding
 for major flows.

Other potential BMP measures to support treatment are to be considered in detailed design:

- Infiltration trenches
- Vegetated Filter strips
- Oil-grit separator units.

- The project corridor interfaces with TRCA lands at 3 bridges and the MSF site.

Conlins MSF

- TRCA has no record of the work done by MX, therefore, their regulation limits and HEC-RAS model does not reflect early works done by MX.
 - The project team would have to go on site for a topographic survey and update the HEC-RAS model.
 - MSF buildings would need a 10 m setback from the floodplain
 - City to reach out to MX for information on early works at the Conlins site.
- TRCA noted that east part of the site will need geotechnical study as it encroaches the top of the slope.

Morningside - Highland Creek Valley - bridge and embankment

- The Morningside-HC bridge would need a Fluvial Geomorphology study at 30% design, if bridge is widened. TRCA would need a study on the type of erosion measure will be above the abutment
- If there is encroachment into the embankment, TRCA would require an updated HEC-RAS model and confirmation that there is no net fill in the TRCA regulated area.
 - TRCA agreed that this work can be deferred to the next phase (30% design)
- TRCA noted that studies to evaluate impact on PSW (Provincially Significant Wetlands?) required at Morningside/Ellesmere in the next phase.

Sheppard - Highland Creek bridges

- Both Highland Creek bridges on Morningside would either have to be substantially widened or replaced to accommodate all of the crosssection elements.
- TRCA would need updated HEC-RAS model and ensure there is no off-site impact. Ensure the span of the bridge does not impact the upstream and downstream to the water surface elevation, and the water velocity. This work can be done at the 30% design phase.
- If the water course is partly concrete, a fluvial geomorphology study would not be needed.

- The Conlins MSF site is within the Morningside Creek Subwatershed of the Rouge River Watershed.
- 2. At the MSF site, there is a hydraulic structure to the north limit which acts as a control structure for an online SWM facility, and another online stormwater facility located south of Sheppard Avenue; we believe a pipe enclosure is also located along the south limit of the property but cannot confirm the extent of construction.
 - a. The proposed south stormwater pipe is enclosed for the August 2005 storm event which exceeds a 100-year storm event requirement.
 - i. Post meeting correction: the August 2005 storm event was used by AECOM for the pipe design, not 2013.
 - ii. No supporting documents or design calculations are available for this pipe.
 - iii. TRCA noted they do not have any records of approving the pipe.
 - iv. Post meeting note: AECOM was coordinating with the Ministry of Natural Resources in 2010 regarding approvals for the proposed pipe. It appears that the pipe construction was not completed.
- 3. HDR asked why the TRCA flood mapping overlaps with the stormwater pipe?
 - TRCA does not consider the presence of stormwater pipe in their hydraulics analysis since TRCA assumes the pipe is obstructed for flood hazard mapping.

- 4. TRCA water resources noted that if the pipe was daylighted, they would consider it in their analysis.
- 5. HDR noted that due to the presence of stormwater infrastructure on the site, the geotechnical and erosion hazard is not natural. The owner of the structure has a responsibility to maintain the structure.
 - a. TRCA Geotech agreed that the natural hazard definition was not applicable since the area is a stormwater management facility, however, requires that a geotechnical investigation be completed, and mitigation measures implemented as required to maintain long-term slope stability.
- 6. Setback requirements
 - a. TRCA Geotech noted that the 10 m buffer from the top of slope is a multi-purpose buffer.
 - b. Reducing buffer from 10 m to 6 m is acceptable for TRCA Geotech if erosion mitigation is implemented. If an access road is built within the buffer, all elements of the road (including grading) would have to be outside of the hazard limits but may be within the 6 m erosion setback, and all loads from the road, including vehicles need to be accounted for to ensure the road does not destabilize the slope.
 - c. TRCA Water Resources mentioned that the 10 m buffer from the floodplain is required since TRCA considers the 10 m buffer to account for model error.
 - d. TRCA Ecologist noted that they require the buffer to be naturalized to prevent flood plain and erosion hazard hence no development would be permissible within the 10 m buffer from the governing natural hazard.
- 7. TRCA confirmed that they consider the open drainage feature a watercourse, not a Headwater Drainage Feature (HDF).
- 8. TRCA advised that daylighting the pipe would require use of natural channel design principles for the open drainage feature.
- TRCA confirmed that survey of the open watercourse through the
 property is required to refine the HEC-RAS hydraulic model and
 corresponding flood hazard definition. Post Meeting Note: City to reach
 out to TRCA to undertake survey.

Feature Based Water Balance Assessment of PSW

- TRCA explained that they would like Wetland Water Balance Risk Tool to be used, confirmed that it is a requirement for 30% detailed design.
- General expectation is that it will be low risk for this project and that mitigation measures through SWM will be sufficient.
- Monthly water balance assessment using Thornthwaite spreadsheet method required at 30% detailed design to support risk assessment.
- TRCA confirmed that pre-construction wetland water balance monitoring is not required.
- Requirements for wetland water balance monitoring during and/or post construction are to be determined based upon results of risk assessment and details established during permitting process.

September 2023 Comments

N/A

- TRCA confirmed that onsite retention would be whichever guideline is more conservative and that 2022 MECP guidelines should be used for water quality.
- TRCA confirms that 5 mm retention (50th percentile event) would be required for Road ROW and 15 mm would be required for MSF site based upon updated requirements for Morningside Tributary within Highland Creek.

Watercourse Management Plan and Regulation 41/24

- TRCA confirmed that the 10 m Regulatory Allowance still applies. Wetland setbacks have changed based upon Regulation 41/24. The rest of the setbacks for regulated features remain the same.
- TRCA confirmed that 65 m planning corridor width is sufficient to be carried forward to refinement in 30% design and stated that natural channels are required for reduced velocity and to achieve floodplain storage.

Next Steps and Timing

- TRCA asked about the outstanding request to stake the MSF site, and when it would be expected to happen. TRCA stated that the preference is to stake the site during the TRPAP phase and not to wait until detailed design.
 - City (TE) responded that the staking exercise requires permission from the property owner and as such does not currently have a timeline.
 City (TE) suggested taking the discussion offline with the property owner.
- City (TE) to setup meeting with TRCA and property owner (MSF)
- TRCA inquired about the timelines for the 30% detailed design.
 - City (TE) responded that they are planning on reporting to City Council before the end of the year on next steps including authority to proceed to the next phase and that there is no timeline yet.
- TRCA inquired about how MSF comments were being captured within the EPR as they believe that a separate tracker with EELRT comments has not yet been captured.
 - HDR responded that the additional comments can be included and requested TRCA to send over the comments.







Summary of Previous Consultation

- TRCA advised that realignment/relocation of the watercourse through the property would need to include:
 - Natural channel design elements (i.e. meander belt)
 - Geotechnical design of side slopes
 - Application of 10 m buffer/Regulatory Allowance from the greatest hazard (anticipated to be stable top of slope for constructed watercourse)
- The application of the above principles would require daylighting the box enclosure (226 m 3.66 m x 2.44 m box)



SWM Requirements for Existing Road

- In Appendix C of the EPR, the report titled, *Eglinton East Transit Project Assessment Process (TPAP)*, 10% Detailed Design, Drainage and Stormwater Management Report, dated February 27, 2024, notes that the TRCA SWM Criteria applies only to the addition of impervious areas. Note that the TRCA SWM Criteria for the road right of ways applies to both the addition of impervious area and the existing impervious area that encompass the proposed works. Any road right of way that includes new or upgraded storm sewers and infrastructure, should take the existing and proposed impervious area (entire widened road width and length) of the road for SWM treatment based TRCA SWM Criteria for road right of ways as previously provided since the onset of the EPR. Revise report text and design as required to ensure this.
- **Proposed HDR Response:** SWM for the existing paved areas will be provided to the Maximum Extent Possible in accordance with current MECP Guidelines and municipal CLI-ECA requirements. This will be further explored and documented at detailed design.







Erosion and Geotechnical Hazard Assessments

- For the crossings (example: Highland Creek Area), the risk of erosion hazard needs to be determined by slope stability assessment.
- Appropriate geotechnical and stability study and design recommendations need to be developed and implemented in support of the proposed works including earthworks, grading, and site alterations.
- **HDR Response:** Erosion hazard and geotechnical investigations will be completed at detailed design.








Feature Based Water Balance Assessment of PSW

- Given the potential SWM changes, a feature-based water balance risk evaluation should be undertaken to inform the feature-base water balance (FBWB) requirements for the project. The FBWB risk evaluation will assess if there are any potential risks to the hydrology of the adjacent PSW from the proposed grade and drainage changes. Please see TRCA's Wetland Water Balance Risk Assessment to assist with this process. WetlandWaterBalanceRiskEvaluation_Nov2017.pdf (trca.ca)
- HDR Response: A features-based water balance assessment will be completed as part of the detailed design, if required based upon the outcome of the risk assessment and discussions with TRCA. Please note that, based upon the nature of the work to support linear infrastructure, and the extent of new impervious surfaces proposed, it is anticipated that this would qualify as a low risk undertaking and not require a full assessment. Further, it is anticipated that any potential impacts would be mitigated through the stormwater management plan, incorporating LIDs as part of a treatment train approach for stormwater quality control and water budget management.

September 2023 Comments

- Note that in addition to the materials reviewed in this project, detailed comments on the Maintenance and Storage Facility (MSF) were provided on September 15, 2023 (TRCA comments). However, the overarching SWM comments on the MSF provided as part of this EPR in the earlier design stages still apply to the separate MSF submission.
 - For the stormwater management, please meet the TRCA SWM Criteria (2012; link here:
 https://sustainabletechnologies.ca/app/uploads/2013/01/SWM-Criteria-2012.pdf). Please note that TRCA requires water quantity controls and erosion hazard controls (also known as the 5mm on-site retention). For water quantity controls, existing peak flows should be met under proposed conditions for the entire catchment area for road right of way. For erosion hazard controls, 5mm on-site retention is required from all impervious surfaces above the initial abstraction. Please note that water quality treatment is required prior to infiltration.
 - For stormwater management, TRCA recommends 80% TSS removal for water quality treatment as part of a treatment train approach. For this recommendation, please note that an OGS sized for 80% TSS removal for 90% of the annual rainfall is credited 50% TSS removal. However, an OGS plus 5mm on-site retention (required as part of erosion hazard control) is credited 80% TSS removal.
- **HDR Response:** The draft report will be updated to reflect the TRCA stormwater management criteria, and the specific management plan will be determined at detailed design.






