

Woodbine Avenue Bridge Rehabilitation under Metrolinx Rail

Contract: 24ECS-BE-13PM Start Date: October 2024 End Date: April 2025* *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto will rehabilitate the Woodbine Avenue Bridge under Metrolinx Rail. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2024 Capital Works Program.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Repair and refurbish the existing Woodbine Avenue Bridge under Metrolinx Rail
- · Reface concrete abutment walls, wingwalls, and sidewalk supporting walls
- · Reconstruct elevated concrete sidewalks
- Remove and install new pedestrian railings
- Patch repair and crack injection of the substructure's pier, deck soffit, and fascia
- Reconstruct the crash protection at the south end of pier
- · Replace luminaires and conduits under the bridge
- Restore roadway in front of curbs as required

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

• You may experience dust, noise, and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.



Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required. No work will occur on Sundays and Statutory Holidays.



Construction Notice



Pre-Construction Inspection: The City's hired contractor will conduct inspections of properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Affected properties will receive a separate notice to set up an appointment for the inspection.

The inspection will look at the exterior and interior of properties to verify existing conditions. Although participation is voluntary, the City encourages all property owners to participate. Without the survey, it will be difficult to confirm any claims of damage caused by construction. All inspection staff will wear photo I.D. and carry photo equipment for this work.



Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

At least one sidewalk will remain open at all times. Temporary signage will direct pedestrians to safely cross the bridge.



Traffic Management: Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Road users might expect minor delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.

Traffic on Woodbine Avenue under the bridge will be reduced to one lane in each direction during construction.



Cyclists: During construction the bike lane will be temporarily closed through the work zone. Signs will be posted directing cyclists and drivers to share the lane, single file, through the work zone.



Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the **Field Ambassador** listed below.



Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete, and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
