## Portland – Dan Leckie Cycling Connections Installation: Queens Wharf Road to Queens Quay

Start Date: Week of October 14, 2024 | End Date: October 28, 2024 \*Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto is preparing to install the Dan Leckie segment of Portland-Dan Leckie Cycling Connections Project on Dan Leckie Way from Queens Wharf Road to Queens Quay. The project was approved by the Infrastructure and Environment Committee in March 2024, and is part of the Council-approved 2024 Cycling Network Plan. The project, once complete, will provide a safe cycling route from Queen Street West to Queens Quay West, running along Portland Street – across the Puente De Luz pedestrian/cycling bridge – and down Dan Leckie Way.

## **Project Overview**

The portion of Dan Leckie Way from Queen's Wharf Road to Fort York Boulevard, is planned for installation in October 2024. Key changes include:

- Installation of a bi-directional (two-way) protected cycle track on the east side of Dan Leckie Way from Queen's Warf Road to Queen's Quay.
- Removal of 8 parking spots on the east side of Dan Leckie Way between Fort York Boulevard and Queen's Warf Road
- Relocation of the northbound school bus stop from the east side of Dan Leckie Way to southbound on the west side (directly across the street). Parents and students will be informed through TDSB and signage. Students will cross at the crosswalk at the all-way stop signs.
- Introduction of painted bicycle turn boxes at Fort York Boulevard and at Queen's Quay.
- Minor adjustments to motor vehicle lane widths and traffic signals.

Three segments of concrete work to support the bikeway were completed in August 2024. The portion of the bikeway on Portland Street is planned to be installed in 2025 to accommodate the construction of the King/Bathurst Ontario Line Station.




## What to Expect During Installation

The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts of noise and other inconveniences. There will be short periods of motor vehicle lane disruptions. City services such as Fire, Paramedics and garbage pick-up will continue as usual. We appreciate your patience.

During installation, the City's contractors will complete the following work:

- Removal of existing road line markings where adjustments are required.
- Painting of new line markings and road symbols where adjustments occur.
- Installation of pre-cast concrete curbs and reflective bollards.
- Adjustment of signals to include bicycle signal lights.
- Construction of a bike box and curb ramp at Queen's Quay to connect to the Martin Goodman Trail.
