
Finch Hydro Corridor Multi-Use Trail Construction Adjacent to McNicoll Avenue from Pharmacy Avenue to Birchmount Road

Contract #: 17ECS-TI-110LR

Expected Start Date: Fall 2024 | Expected End Date: Spring 2025 *Timeline is subject to change. Future notice to be provided.

The City of Toronto is preparing to construct a new multi-use trail along the Finch Hydro Corridor from Pharmacy Avenue to Birchmount Road, south of McNicoll Avenue. As part of this work, signalized pedestrian/cyclist crossings and streetlight modifications will be completed at the intersections of Warden Avenue/McNicoll Avenue and Birchmount Road/McNicoll Avenue. This project is part of Transportation Services 2024 Capital Work Program.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.



Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible.
