TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE: Joel Swirsky Boulevard

Contract: 21ECS-LU-10FP

Expected Start Date: Monday, September 23, 2024

Expected End Date: Monday, October 7, 2024

Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the sanitary sewer system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding. Due to the nature of the sanitary sewer construction work, access to Joel Swirsky Boulevard between Faywood Boulevard and Ambassador Place will be partially closed. Local traffic and emergency access will be maintained for residents on Tillingham Keep. This partial road closure will occur between **September 23, 2024, to October 7, 2024.**

This project is part of the Council-approved 2023 Basement Flooding Protection Program to improve the water distribution system, renew our aging infrastructure and reduce the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups and flooding.

WORK DETAILS

For this project, the contractor will:

- Modify and upgrade the sanitary sewer system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property. Please ensure that you remove/arrange for removal of each item prior to construction.

	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets as access to Joel Swirsky Boulevard between Faywood Boulevard and Ambassador Place will be partially closed. Local traffic and emergency access will be maintained on Tillingham Keep for residents. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.</p>
	<p>Physical Distancing: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing.</p>
	<p>Pedestrians: The work may require temporary sidewalk restrictions. If pedestrians do not have any access to the existing sidewalk, the sidewalk will be detoured to an area adjacent to the work zone with protected barricades or will be detoured to the nearest controlled intersection to cross according to the traffic control set up.</p>
	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
