### **New Park at 20 Castlefield Avenue**


- 3,750 m2 (the size of 8.6 NBA basketball courts or 2.3 NHL rinks)
- Current use: temporary recreational amenities, some construction staging on the eastern portion of the site

- 1,232 m2 park (about the size of 5 tennis courts)
- Current use: construction staging



### **20 Castlefield**

Capital Projects Design & Delivery

Acquisition	For the City to approve the development of the building at 2400 Yonge Street, the developer (First Capital) was required to provide the City with new parkland.	As part of the Official Plan and Yonge-Eglinton Secondary Plan, Parks, Forestry & Recreation acquired 20 Castlefield to provide the Yonge-Eglinton area with additional park and open space.
Engagement and Design Process	Parks, Forestry & Recreation will lead the engagement and design process for both new parks.	
Development of Design Options	Design options will be created by award winning landscape architecture, and urban design firm DTAH.	A design consultant will be hired through the City of Toronto's procurement process to develop design options.
Construction	First Capital will construct the park with oversight and involvement from Parks, Forestry & Recreation.	Construction will be managed by Parks, Forestry & Recreation, the design consultant, and a procured contractor.
Maintenance	Both parks will be owned and maintained by Parks, Forestry & Recreation.



## **Phase 1 Community Design Framework**

## **Vision Statement**

A big-picture sentence or paragraph that describes the ideal future for the space.

## **Guiding Principles**

A set of recommendations that clarify the vision statement by describing how people might use the space, or how it should look or feel.

## **Big Moves**

Specific suggestions for how the physical design can achieve the Vision Statement and Guiding Principles.

This process creates a shared understanding of the project's goals, to inspire and guide future decisions.







#### **Vision Statement**

A Vision Statement is a short sentence or paragraph that describes the big-picture goals and objectives of a project.

The project team has written a **DRAFT** vision statement based on feedback from the online survey and pop-up events.

**DRAFT** Vision Statement for the New Park at 20 Castlefield

The new park at 20 Castlefield will be a vibrant, sustainable public space that fosters play, connection and relaxation for visitors of all ages.

The park will provide active recreation areas such as sport courts where people can play sports and exercise.

The park will feature sustainable materials and include greenery and plantings to create an escape from the city where people can connect with nature.

The park will have plenty of shaded, accessible seating for people of all ages to relax individually or with friends and family.

The park will be flexible, with the option to host small events and adapt to the community's evolving needs.




