Emergency Bridge Closure Twyn Rivers Drive Bridge over Rouge River Closed to Motorized Traffic Until Replacement Completion

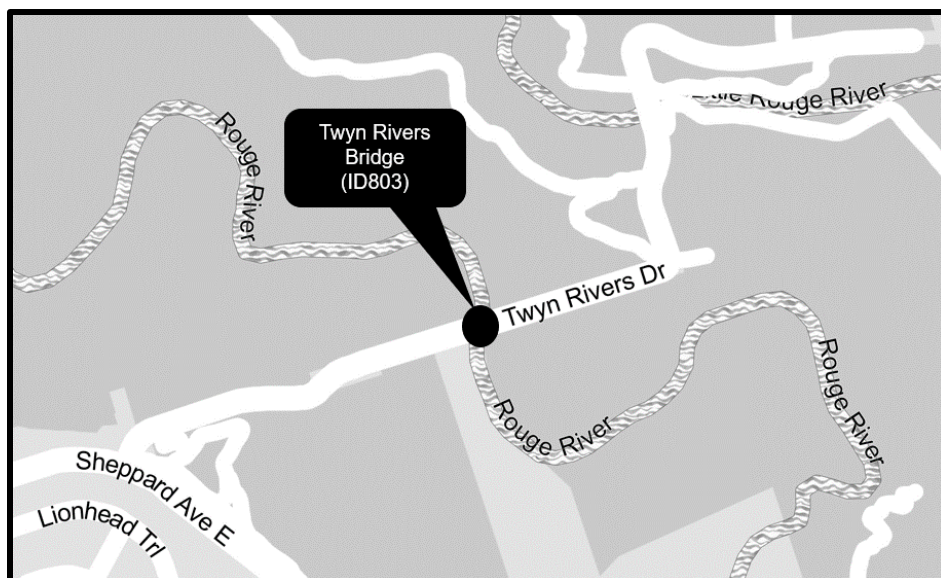
Permanent Replacement Construction Start Date: Early 2027

Following safety concerns identified during regular inspections, the City of Toronto closed the Twyn Rivers Drive bridge over the Rouge River (also known as Stott's Bridge) to all motorized and vehicular traffic in July 2024. A thorough assessment of bridge repair and replacement options confirmed that a full bridge replacement is required to ensure the long-term safety and viability of the structure.

The Twyn Rivers Drive Bridge is one of the bridges identified to be replaced through the [Rouge Park Bridge Transportation Master Plan](#) (TMP), as adopted by Council at its [March 20-21, 2024 meeting](#). The TMP report will be finalized and made available for a 30-day review period over the next several months. Design and construction of the Twyn Rivers Drive bridge replacement will be expedited to begin in early 2027. In the interim, the Twyn Rivers Drive bridge will remain open to pedestrians and cyclists but must stay closed to all motorized traffic for safety reasons.

We understand the impact of this closure on the community and appreciate your patience as we work to deliver a safer, more reliable Twyn Rivers Drive Bridge.
