Basement Flooding Protection Program Fairbank-Silverthorn Storm System- Phase 2 Construction on Earlscourt Avenue

Contract #: 23ECS-MI-03FS

Start Date: January 2025

Expected End Date: June 2025*

The City of Toronto is advancing construction of a new storm sewer system that will collect, store and move stormwater (rain and melted snow) from the Fairbank-Silverthorn area to Black Creek. This work is part of the City's Basement Flooding Protection Program to help reduce the risk of future basement flooding. Once complete, the new storm sewer system will help to reduce the impact of heavy rainfall and sewer back-ups for more than 4,600 homes in your area.

The City's contractor will be installing new storm sewers on Earlscourt Avenue from January to April 2025. Works will take place beginning at the intersection of Earlscourt and Eversfield Avenue, and ending at the intersection of Earlscourt Avenue and Rogers Road. This work will be done in block-by-block segments to prevent long-term road restrictions. Once sewer related works are completed, road resurfacing and restoration will take place. The works will be done in the following blocks as seen in the Map on page 2:

- Block 1: Rogers Road to Teignmouth Avenue
- Block 2: Teignmouth Avenue to Eversfield Road

The following traffic restrictions will apply during construction:

- Earlscourt Avenue will be limited to local traffic during the block segment construction. Driveways may be affected for short durations between 242 – 298 Earlscourt Avenue. A separate driveway notice will be submitted at least 48 hours before works take place.
- Pedestrian access to properties will be maintained at all times.
 - The west sidewalk on Earlscourt Avenue between #242 Earlscourt Avenue to #298 Earlscourt Avenue will experience localized closures.
 - The east sidewalk on Earlscourt Avenue between #243A Earlscourt Avenue to #285 Earlscourt Avenue will also experience localized closures.

WORK DETAILS

The contractor will:

- Excavate the road and dig a trench
- Install new sanitary sewers
- Install new storm sewers
- Reconstruct the sidewalks
- Road resurfacing

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property, so please ensure that you remove/arrange for removal of each item prior to construction.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.</p>

	<p>Important information for owners of sprinkler systems/heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage. This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. For details on removal of such items, please contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
	<p>Road Closure: During construction, one or both lanes on Earls court Avenue from Eversfield Avenue to Rogers Road will be closed in block-by-block segments to allow for the work to be carried out in the safest manner. Earls court Avenue will also be limited to local traffic only. Beginning January 20, 2025, vehicular parking from Teignmouth Avenue to Rogers Road will be prohibited during the working hours of 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Vehicles left unattended will be subject to “friendly towing.” Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Sidewalk Access: Pedestrian access to properties will be maintained at all times. The west sidewalk on Earls court Avenue between #242 Earls court Avenue to #298 Earls court Avenue will experience localized closures. The east sidewalk on Earls court Avenue between #243A Earls court Avenue to #285 Earls court Avenue will also experience localized closures. A working sidewalk will be maintained at all times for pedestrian usage.</p> <p>Driveway Access: Your driveway might be affected during the construction. Please note that you will be notified with a separate notice that specifies the duration of the driveway impact if applicable.</p> <p>Street Parking: Street parking will not be available during construction. Arrangements for alternate streets should be considered.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby side streets. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p>
	<p>Parking Violation Notices: <u>Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date in order to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) or 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with Dispute the parking violation notice online, by mail or in person (follow instructions on the back of the violation notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction or 3. Contact the Field Ambassador listed below, and provide a photo of your ticket and ticket number, along with your contact information. <p>If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy.</p>

	<p>Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e., in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones).</p> <p>In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.</p>
	<p>Accessibility Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure that safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
	<p>Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that your bins are labelled with your address.</i></p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Full restoration will be completed by the contractor.</p>
