

Congratulations on your successful application to the CIHR Planning and Dissemination Grant for Implementing Healthy Urban Policy. As part of this opportunity, you will attend an Immersive Study Workshop in Copenhagen, Denmark, hosted by 8 80 Cities.

8 80 Cities is a non-profit organization based in Toronto, Canada, that works internationally. Our mission is to ignite action and challenge the status quo to create healthier, more equitable, and sustainable cities for all people. Over the last 17 years, we have been challenging cities on how they plan, design, and manage their public spaces by asking a simple but powerful question: what if everything we do in our public spaces is great for an 8-year-old and an 80-year-old?

We are specialists in supporting community-led investment in sustainable mobility and equitable multigenerational public spaces. We have extensive experience leading innovative city-building programs that bring together diverse partners from various sectors and across multiple levels of government. Our multidisciplinary team of urban and cultural planners, urban designers, community development specialists, and communication strategists have led transformative human-centered mobility and public space projects around the world.


