Sanitary forcemain replacement on your street


Phase 2 Start Date: February 2025

Phase 2 End Date: August 2025

In October 2024, the City of Toronto distributed a Construction Notice for a sanitary forcemain (a pressurized sewer pipe that transports wastewater from a lower to higher elevation) replacement in your neighbourhood. This project is part of the Council-approved Capital Works Program to renew aging infrastructure, reducing the risk of forcemain breaks and collapses.

The City will be finished Phase 1 construction activities on Blue Jays Way south of Front Street West to Navy Wharf Court on schedule by April 15, 2025. Active construction on Phase 2 will begin in February 2025 on Navy Wharf Court between Blue Jays Way and Bremner Boulevard and at the Skydome Sewage Pumping Station. This is earlier than the July 2025 start date last reported to you in the previous Construction Notice. Phase 2 work is expected to be completed by August 2025 with restoration work, where required, expected to be completed following construction. Please see a map of the work area below.

There will be no through way access between Bremner Boulevard and Blue Jays Way.• Driveway access for properties on Navy Wharf Court will be maintained for residents during construction.• For a portion of construction, the north crosswalk of Navy Wharf Court and Bremner Boulevard will be closed to pedestrians and a detour route will be in place. Signage will be put in place advising of the closure.• For a portion of construction, the east sidewalk of Navy Wharf Court and Bremner Boulevard will be closed to pedestrians and a detour route will be in place. Signage will be put in place advising of the closure.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

	Work hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required and in accordance with the City of Toronto's Noise Bylaw. You will be notified in advance of any changes to work hours. The weekday evening work hours allow the City's contractor to complete work for Phases 1 and 2 in an expedited way to meet construction deadlines.
	Construction noise: You may experience intermittent noise and vibration during construction (from vacuum trucks, power generators, air compressors, etc.). All work will comply with the City of Toronto's Noise Bylaw.
	Road and sidewalk access: To safely complete the work, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Driveway access on Navy Wharf Court will be maintained in Phase 2. Access for local traffic for residents living on Navy Wharf Court in Phase 2 will be maintained. *subject to change
	Traffic management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Permanent restoration of the curb and sidewalk will take place within 18 to 24 months.
	Accessible accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
