Road Resurfacing on Rathnelly Avenue from Macpherson Avenue to Poplar Plains Crescent and Pedestrian Infrastructure Improvements


Contract: 24ECS-RD-102LR Start Date: February 18, 2025, End Date: November 28, 2025

The City of Toronto will resurface Rathnelly Avenue from Macpherson Avenue to Poplar Plains Crescent. Pedestrian Infrastructure Improvements are proposed at the McMaster Street and Poplar plains crescent intersections. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaying and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2024 Capital Works Program to renew aging City roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

The City's contractor will:

- Dig up the road surface
- Re-align maintenance holes and catch basins
- Repair curbs and gutters
- Repave the road surface

Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. *Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.*

Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
