More housing options supported by infrastructure

New housing options are needed, including affordable, rental and family-sized units, supported by adequate infrastructure, services and facilities that benefit a growing community. Concerns were raised about high-rise buildings changing the existing neighbourhood character.



Marlee Avenue as the heart of the community

Marlee Avenue is envisioned as a vibrant and walkable commercial hub with an enhanced public realm, featuring wider sidewalks, more seating options, improved lighting, tree planting, public art and a diverse range of retail and dining options.



Safe, connected and accessible streets

Improvements to mobility and connectivity are needed to create a more accessible and safe community, including better sidewalks, pedestrian crossings, bike lanes, and design to alleviate traffic congestion.



Protecting and enhancing parks and open spaces

Parks are recognized as important gathering spaces. Protection and enhancement of parks is desired, including additional park amenities and facilities, naturalization and transforming underutilized spaces into more functional green spaces.
