	Toronto Shelter and Support Services remains committed to our collective efforts to harm reduction and the support of individuals who use drugs within Toronto's shelter system. While the Ontario government's <u>Community Care</u> and <u>Recovery Act</u> will lead to the closure of five supervised consumption sites and two shelter Urgent Public Health Needs sites in Toronto, we want to emphasize that this change will not alter the ongoing efforts within the shelter system to provide harm reduction services.
	Shelter and respite site staff are reminded to follow <u>Toronto Shelter</u> <u>Standards, Section 10.2.1 Harm Reduction</u> and <u>24-Hour Respite Site</u> <u>Standards, Section 8.3.1</u> to ensure that harm reduction remains a foundational principle in supporting our most vulnerable residents. This commitment includes, but is not limited to:
	 Providing harm reduction supplies such as safer-use kits and naloxone Maintaining a non-punitive approach to substance use within shelters Ensuring all staff are trained in overdose prevention, recognition, and response Connecting clients to necessary resources and support to promote safety and well-being Not prohibiting or confiscating life-saving medications, safer drug use supplies, safer sex products, or personal property, including substances Ensuring the safe disposal of all sharps
