

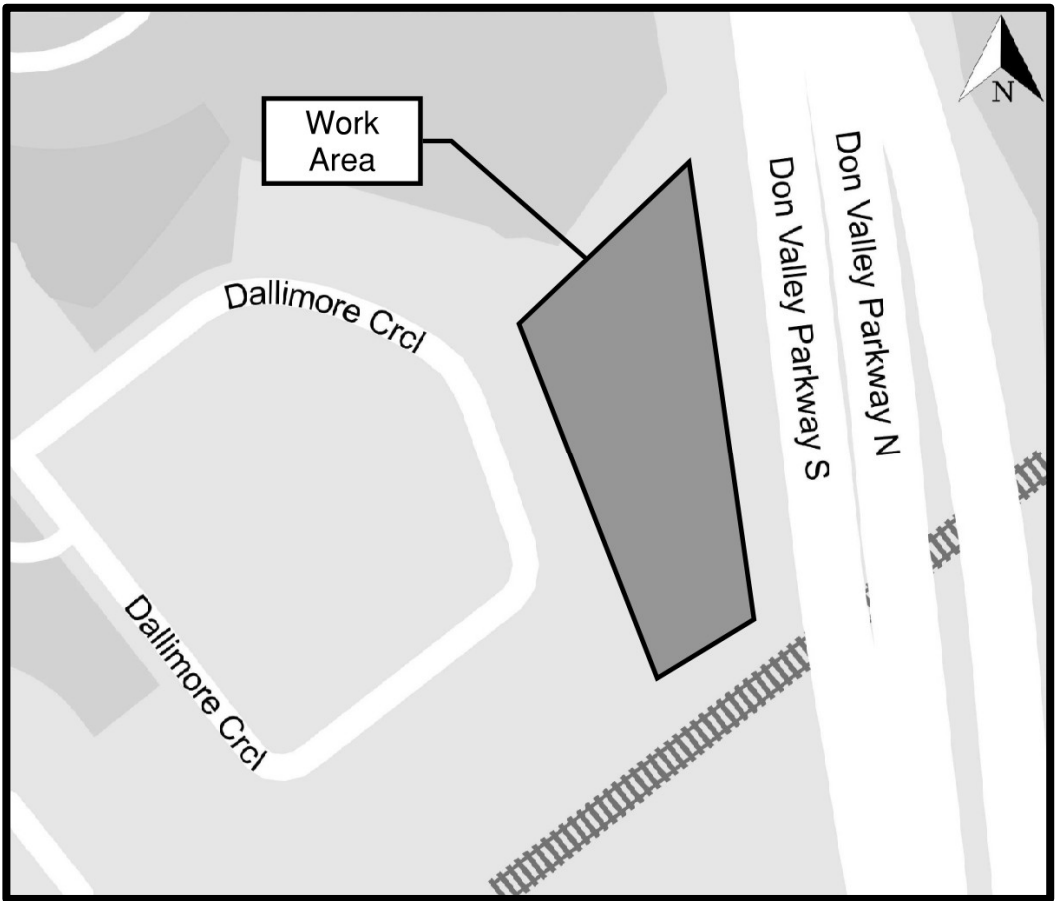

Don Valley Parkway Slope Stabilization at Dallimore Circle

Contract: 24ECS-BE-18AM
 Start Date: March 2025 End Date: October 2025

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the Don Valley Parkway Slope at Dallimore Circle. This work will ensure that the slope meets today’s standards and remains safe for vehicles into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2025 Capital Works Program.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

In the coming weeks, the City’s contractor will:

- Set up work areas on the Don Valley Parkway shoulder
- Mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Remove trees located on city property within the working area

Affected properties will receive an additional letter with more information about required tree removals on city property within the work area.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will occur between the hours of 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday to Friday, and 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Saturday, excluding holidays.</p> <p>Overnight Work: Some tasks will require overnight work. During overnight work, a single lane of the southbound Don Valley Parkway (DVP) will be closed to facilitate the ingress and egress of construction vehicles into the work area.</p>

	<p>Traffic Management: All lanes on the Don Valley Parkway (DVP) will remain open throughout construction during the day. Lanes near the working area will be shifted and realigned to accommodate construction.</p> <p>Road users should expect nightly single lane closures on the DVP during construction.</p> <p>Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on the Don Valley Parkway near the working area.</p>
	<p>Access to Your Home: The City-hired contractor may need access to the exterior of your home to complete tree removals on city property. Affected properties will receive a letter about scheduling and any actions homeowners should take prior to tree removals in the work area.</p>
	<p>Site Safety: Workers on site are responsible for the work assigned to them. If you have construction questions or an issue on site – ask to be directed to the site inspector. If the site inspector is unavailable, contact the person listed at the end of this notice.</p>
