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

Black Creek Drive over Black Creek Bridge Rehabilitation

Contract: 25ECS-BE-04PM Start Date: April 2025 End Date: March 2026 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the Bridge at Black Creek Drive over Black Creek. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe into the future. Further details will be provided in an upcoming Construction Notice. The project is part of the Council-approved 2025 Capital Works Program.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Remove sidewalks and widen roadway shoulders;
- Reconstruct the parapet walls, railings and approach slabs;
- Resurface the approach roadway;
- Reconstruct bearing seat and replace bearings;
- Strengthen girders ends;
- Refacing abutments and patch repair the concrete deck wingwalls and retaining walls;
- Remove concrete skateboarding appurtenances and wood debris; and
- Replace the asphalt surface and waterproofing.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., Saturdays. No work will occur on Sundays and Statutory holidays **unless approved.**

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Construction Notice

| ₽ | Pre-Construction Inspection: The City hired contractor will conduct inspections of properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Affected properties will receive a separate notice to set up an appointment for the inspection. The inspection will look at the exterior and interior of properties to verify existing |
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| | conditions. Although participation is voluntary, the City encourages all property owners to participate. Without the survey, it will be difficult to confirm any claims of damage caused by construction. All inspection staff will wear photo I.D. and carry photo equipment for this work. |
| ÷ | Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. |
| | Sidewalks on the bridge will be removed during construction and will not be replaced in the future. |
| 8 | Traffic Management: |
| | Traffic staging will be implemented and the traffic lanes will be reduced throughout the construction. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side street. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. |
| | Temporary concrete barriers and pylons will be placed on Black Creek Drive, with single-lane reductions in each direction. |
| Ŀ | Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below. |
| | Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October). |
