Repair of TTC Streetcar Track Area on Queen Street West from Fennings Street to Spadina Avenue


Contract: 21ECS-TI-05SP Start Date: Monday, April 21, 2025 End Date: Friday, April 25 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto will be carrying out repairs to the concrete pavement within TTC streetcar track areas on Queen Street West from Fennings Street to Spadina Avenue. The work will take place from Monday, April 21, 2025, at 6 a.m. to Friday, April 25 at 5 a.m., pending weather conditions.

This work will affect travel and on-street parking in the area. Left turns to Queen Street West will be prohibited on multiple streets.

Replacement TTC bus service will be operating on Queen Street West through the work area, between Roncesvalles Avenue and Bay Street.

The City's contractor will remove and replace sections of concrete in the streetcar track area.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.



Work Hours: Work will take place 24 hours. Excavation and concrete breaking will be carried out at various times throughout the day. All concrete breaking activities will occur between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m.

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8	Traffic Management:The work will require lane closures between Fennings Street and Spadina Avenue. One lane will remain open in each direction around the work zones.Left turns to Queen Street will be prohibited at intersections through the work area. Turning movements will be maintained at Ossington Avenue, Shaw Street, Bathurst Street and Spadina Avenue.	
R	Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted, as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.	
	On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. The contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility, company-branded clothing	
	TTC Service Changes: During this work, 501/301 Queen streetcars will divert around the work area via Spadina Avenue and King Street West. There will be no streetcars on Queen Street West between Roncesvalles Avenue and Spadina Avenue.	
	A 501/301 Queen bus will operate on Queen Street West through the work area, between Roncesvalles Avenue and Bay Street. Visit <u>ttc.ca/service-advisories/Service-Changes</u> for the latest updates.	
Ŀ	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible.
