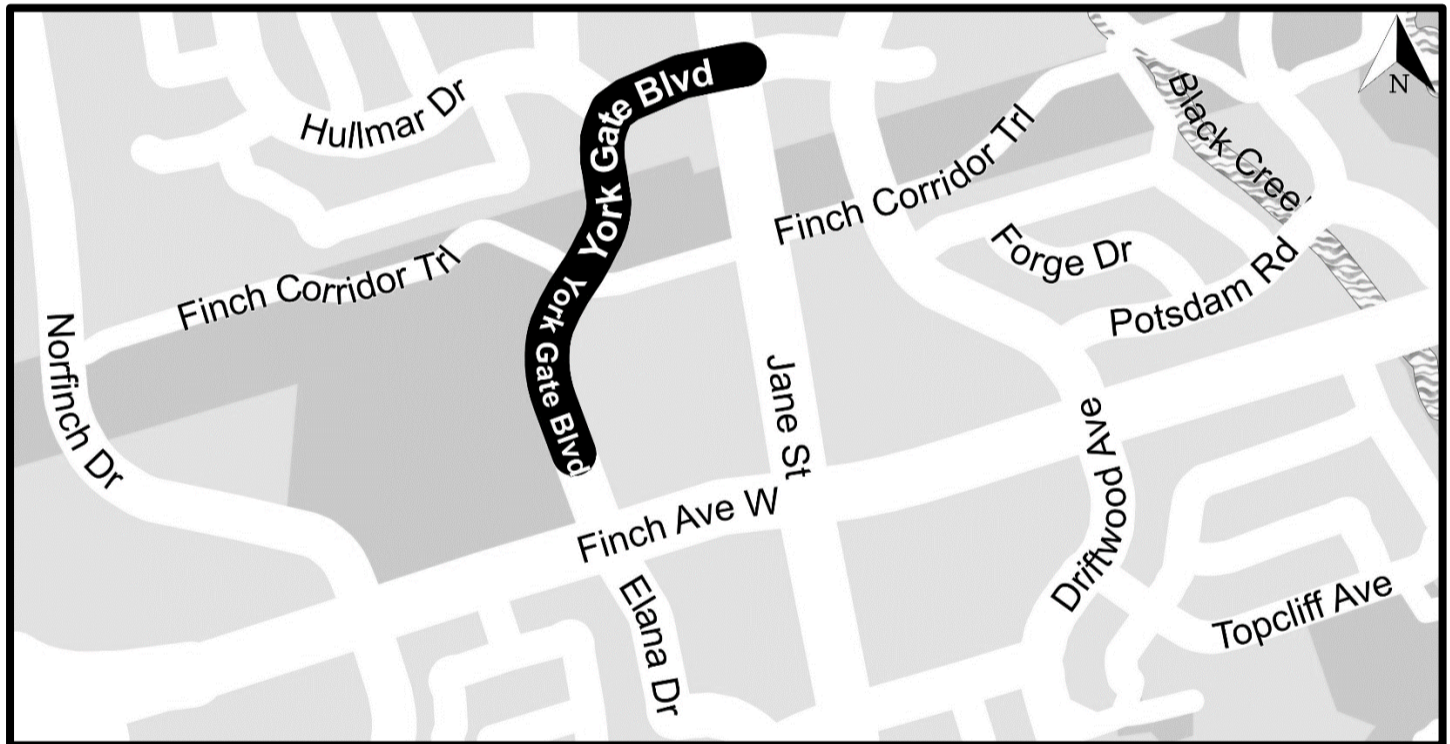
Road Resurfacing on York Gate Boulevard from Jane Street to Finch Avenue West

Contract: 25ECS-RD-03MR
Start Date: August 2025
End Date: December 2025

The City of Toronto is planning to resurface York Gate Boulevard from Jane Street to Finch Avenue West. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaving, and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair. The City will install cycle tracks on both sides of the road along York Gate Blvd, and also upgrade the corresponding TTC bus stops and the signalized intersections at York Gate Blvd and Jane Street and south of Finch Corridor Trail. This will require the removal of the central median at the intersection of York Gate Blvd and Jane Street.


This project is part of the Council-approved 2025 Capital Works Program to renew aging City roads and sidewalks for current and future needs.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.
