PROJECT OVERVIEW

The City of Toronto is building new affordable homes at 35 Bellevue Ave.

This site will have a four storey building and provide 78 affordable homes with supports to maintain people's health, wellbeing, and housing stability.



UPCOMING CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES AND EXPECTED IMPACTS

Early Construction Activities – Spring 2025

Starting in May, the City's construction contractor will begin shoring work, a temporary activity that involves installing supports around the excavation area to keep the surrounding soil stable. Once shoring is in place, crews will begin excavating the site and then forming and pouring the building's concrete foundation. These activities mark the start of below-ground construction and are expected to continue into September.



Expected Impact	How the Construction Crew is Reducing the Impact
Noise	Using quieter backup alarms on trucks.
You may hear moderate noise from excavators, trucks, and other equipment.	Limiting truck and machinery idling.
	 Using electric power from the grid to reduce generator noise.
	 Maintaining smooth surfaces to reduce equipment clatter.
	Scheduling deliveries at appropriate times.
Vibration Some moderate vibration may be felt during shoring work.	 Monitoring systems have been installed on nearby buildings to ensure vibration remains within safe, acceptable levels.
Dust and Air Quality Dust may be visible during excavation and construction activity.	Following a dust control plan.
	Regular site monitoring.
	 Using dust suppression methods during excavatio.n
Traffic Construction vehicles will enter and exit the site on Bellevue Ave.	 All work will take place within the fenced construction area.
	 Traffic signage will be in place for the duration of the project to ensure safety.
	 Traffic safety personnel will be in place to guide trucks in and out of the site.
Pedestrian Access	 Crews will aim to keep the sidewalk and bike lane on Bellevue Ave. open as much as possible throughout construction. Notice of any temporary closures will be posted at least one week in advance.
	 Overhead line protection for the hydro lines will be installed to ensure a safe and accessible pathway is maintained.
