Watermain cleaning and relining on your street

Contract: 24TW-CTS-08CWD Start Date: December 9, 2024 End Date: October 31, 2025

In November 2024, the City of Toronto distributed a Construction Notice for watermain cleaning and relining work. The original scope of work was planned to take place on **Dalbeattie Avenue**, **Farnsworth Drive**, **Lockerbie Avenue**, **Deerhurst Avenue and Kames Avenue**. Work is also taking place on **Queenslea Avenue between Pelmo Crescent and Langside Avenue**.


The work area will now also include:

- Pelmo Crescent between Kames Avenue and Longview Drive.
- A portion of Longview Drive for a bout 100 metres south of Pelmo Cresent.

Please see a map of the updated work area below.

This project is part of the Council-approved Capital Works Program to renew Toronto's aging infrastructure, improve water distribution and reduce the risk of watermain breaks.

REMAINING WORK TO BE DONE

Construction crews will:

- Conduct preliminary investigative work including pre-condition surveys
- Excavate pits in the road to access the watermain;
- Install a temporary water supply system and attach your house/building to the supply;
- Clean and structurally reline the existing watermain;
- Replace any City-owned water service pipes that do not meet City standards (from the watermain to the private property line); and
- Remove the temporary water supply and restore all work areas with asphalt, concrete or grass.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items such as landscaping and/or decorative objects located within City property limits (boulevard). If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Field Ambassador (see contact information at the bottom of this notice).
- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes removing and replacing a portion of driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.
