Intersection Improvements at Deauville Lane and Grenoble Drive

Contract: 23ECS-RD-10SP

Expected Start Date: June 2nd, 2025, Expected End Date: July 2025

*Timeline is subject to change.

Starting early June, the City of Toronto plans to reconstruct the intersection at Deauville Lane and Grenoble Drive. This project is part of the Council-approved 2024 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

As part of the upcoming work, the City will be making changes to the design of the intersection to increase safety and connectivity for all road users. Changes include:

- Removing the right-turn channels to create shorter, more direct travel paths for people walking and people cycling.
- Widening sidewalks and increasing green space with trees, plantings and places to sit.

The <u>Vision Zero Road Safety Plan</u> calls for engineering improvements where they are most needed to protect vulnerable users of our transportation system – people walking, children, seniors and people cycling.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that construction work does not interfere with these utilities
- Remove the road surface and road base materials
- Relocation of streetlights
- Re-align maintenance holes and stormwater catch basins
- Install a granular base and base asphalt
- Pave the road surface
- Install new trees and plantings
- Restore driveways and other areas impacted by construction

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
 The City will not be reasonable for demonst to any privately surged items on City preparty.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	Work Hours : Work will take place from 7 a.m.to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
<u> </u>	Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.
<u>aa aa</u> aa aa	This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the Public Consultation Unit listed below.
÷	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

	Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
8	Traffic Management : Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.
	Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i>
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - April to June and September to October.
