# Closure on East Side of St. Clair Avenue East and Rexleigh Drive.



The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the sanitary sewer system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding. The City's Contractor Clearway Construction Inc. will be completing sanitary upgrades on the east bound lane of St. Claire Avenue East. The east bound lane will be closed. The intersection of St. Clair Avenue East and Rexleigh Drive will be closed. Due to the nature of this work, the west bound lane on St. Clair Avenue East will be reduced to one lane each direction in the vicinity of the work zone. The west bound lane will be open at all times throughout the duration of this work.

This work is scheduled to take place from 7:00 a.m. on Monday, June 9, 2024, to 7:00 p.m. Wednesday, June 18, 2024.

This project is part of the Council-approved Basement Flooding Protection Program to improve the water distribution system, renew our aging infrastructure and reduce the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups and flooding.

#### **WORK DETAILS**

The contractor will:

- Excavate the road and dig a trench to access and install the sanitary sewer.
- Temporarily restore the road.

#### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- The community will experience dust, noise and traffic delays.
- The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.



**Traffic Management**: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents

Traffic on St. Clair Avenue East will be reduced to one lane.

- The East bound lane on St. Clair Avenue East will be closed.
- The West bound lane on St. Clair Avenue East will be open for one lane of traffic each way.
- The intersection of St. Clair Avenue East and Rexleigh Drive will be closed.
- Traffic from Rexleigh Drive will be detoured via Glenwood Crescent to Saint Columba Place.



**Physical Distancing:** There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing and will maintain physical distancing.



**Pedestrians:** The work may require temporary sidewalk restrictions, however any necessary sidewalk closures will alternate in each direction to ensure pedestrian access is maintained during construction.



**Work Hours:** Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.



**Accessible Accommodation:** The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
