Overnight Milling and Paving on Dufferin Street from Dupont Street to south of Shanly Street

Contract: 24ECS-RD-05MR Start Date: June 2 from 7 p.m. End Date: June 13 at 9 p.m. *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto's work on Dufferin Street, Millicent Street and Hallam Street is progressing well. This notice is to provide an update on the milling and paving operations.

Milling and paving operations are being conducted at night to minimize daytime disruptions and reduce the impacts to traffic congestion, especially during peak hours, as well as expedite the schedule of the project in the downtown area.

On two separate nights, between **Monday, June 2 at 7 p.m. and Friday, June 13 at 9 p.m.,** the contractor plans to grind existing pavement, perform road base repairs and base layer asphalt paving along the east side of Dufferin Street from 120 metres south of Shanly Street to approximately 170 metres south of Dupont Street. The Contractor is permitted to work 24 hours a day until the work can be completed.

Please note these dates are tentative and subject to change.

When this overnight work is complete, regular work hours will resume. Your patience and understanding are appreciated during this disruption.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

 You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.



Road and Sidewalk Access: To complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will always be maintained.

Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.

Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.

Traffic on Dufferin Street will be reduced to one lane each direction.

While the east side of Dufferin Street is closed for the milling and paving operations, the west side will be open to traffic for one lane in each direction with transition areas at the north and south limits of working zone.



Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
